Articulation Agreement between Minot State University and Minnesota State Community & Technical College

Introduction: This articulation agreement formally recognizes that Minot State University (hereinafter MiSU) and Minnesota State Community and Technical College (hereinafter MSCTC) are educational institutions which agree to work together to provide educational opportunities for the students of their institutions.

Purpose: The purpose of this agreement is to provide clear and simple transfer pathway options from MSCTC to MiSU for students interested in American Sign Language (ASL) and/or Sign Language Interpreter Training (SLIT) programs. MSCTC students who earn a ASL Studies certificate or an Associate's (AA or AS) degree that contains the ASL Studies certificate, and wish to further their education can transfer to MiSU seamlessly and complete one or more of the following programs via distance delivery:

- 1. American Sign Language Studies Certificate
- 2. Sign Language Interpreter Training Certificate
- 3. One or both of the American Sign Language Studies Minor and/or Sign Language Interpreter Training Minor embedded in a Bachelor of Individualized Studies (BIS) or Bachelor of General Studies (BGS)

Goals and Activities:

The collaborative effort set forth in this articulation agreement serves the common goals of:

- Providing a range of quality educational opportunities for students to meet their personal and career goals.
- Preparing high quality professionals with knowledge of ASL and Deaf culture
- Preparing high quality professionals equipped to provide interpreting services for individuals who are Deaf or hard of hearing (DHH) in educational and other settings within the community.

These goals will be achieved by:

- 1. Offering MSCTC students an option to complete an advanced certificate in ASL Studies from MiSU.
- 2. Offering MSCTC students an option to complete an advanced certificate in ASL Studies from MiSU and a certificate in SLIT.
- 3. Offering MSCTC students a distance pathway to a Bachelor's degree completion after a) completing an ASL Studies certificate at MSCTC, or b) a 2+2 sequence after completion of an AA or AS degree that contains the ASL Studies certificate from MSCTC.
- 4. Providing candidates with a broad knowledge base in disciplines complimentary to the field of SLIT through Bachelor's level education.

5. Increasing the number of personnel available to deliver interpreting services for individuals who are DHH.

Accreditation: Both MiSU and MSCTC are accredited by the Higher Learning Commission.

Longevity of Agreement: This agreement will begin for the 2023-24 academic year. This agreement will be in effect for five years and reviewed annually. Appendices can be updated as needed. If the program is terminated, students who have begun the program and are in the process of completion will be allowed to finish as stipulated by this memorandum. This document represents an ongoing commitment between the organizations and can be reviewed at any time at the request of either party.

Termination or Revisions: MiSU and MSCTC agree to provide at least 90 days advance written notification of their intent to terminate this agreement. All revisions and amendments to this agreement require written approval by those who sign this agreement or their successors.

Governance: This agreement shall be governed by and in compliance with the academic policies and procedures of MiSU, the ND University System and MSCTC, MinnState and the requirements of the Higher Learning Commission. The Program Directors at each institution, in consultation with their respective supervisors will work collaboratively to resolve any potential logistical challenges.

Advising: The Program Director at MSCTC (Ms. Kristi Hilton) and the Program Director at MiSU (Dr. Holly Pedersen) will collaboratively advise students preparing to transition from MSCTC to MiSU. Students seeking a Bachelor's degree will work collaboratively with Dr. Pedersen and the appropriate Bachelor's degree program director for advising.

Admission: In their final semester with MSCTC, students will make application to MiSU and become admitted students. Students must meet admissions requirements at MiSU and submit transcripts from all institutions they attended. Students may choose to study on the MiSU campus or at a distance.

Graduation Requirements: The specific courses of study for each program option at MiSU are outlined in the appendices. BIS and BGS degrees require a minimum of 120 semester hours of total credit. Course equivalencies and substitutions for MSCTC courses are noted in the programs of study.

Notices: All notices concerning this memorandum of agreement and understanding shall be in writing and will be considered to have been given at the time of receipt of notice by the other Party.

Insurance: The Parties agree to provide each other proof of insurance upon request.

Independence of the Parties: The Parties are independent contractors. Nothing contained in this Agreement will constitute either Party the agent, partner, or legal representative of the other Party for any purpose or constitute the Parties as partners. Neither Party has any right, power, or authority to create any obligation or responsibility on behalf of the other.

Effective Date: This Memorandum of Understanding is effective on the date signed below.
