Brent Winiger: Hartnett Hall renovation update

• The company will not allow a clause to make sure if overdue/late on completion that they incur charges/fee.

Fall 2012 Classes

- Currently about 80 classes still scheduled in Hartnett this fall
- Need to move them to other locations or other times and locations.
- Other classes may need to be adjusted to facilitate relocations of classes.
- Some 11 am courses will need to be moved to other times (8am, 9am or 1pm) try to stay away from 3pm or later due to Athletics.
- Holly Pedersen suggested to start with spreadsheet of classes triage each course/class.
 - Move class to different room
 - o Move to online (be careful to have enough face-to-face classes for international students)
- CJ has moved 95% of their classes

Ideas for classrooms:

- Jones & Westlie are both rooms where good teaching could happen.
- IVN rooms in Admin used to be perfectly fine classrooms when we were up there and with IVN on the way out perhaps that could work.
 - o MiSU has moved away from the IVN set up and DBC does use the rooms.
 - o Rooms are larger and could make good classrooms
- The big room where Libby & Elizabeth Sund are now might make an adequate classroom
- Old Main 203a is open at times small seminar room.
- The library has a conference room that could double as a seminar room.
- The press boxes in the stadium have TVs and chairs and typically are not used during the week. That's several potential rooms.
- OM 324 which is a small conference room (seats 8) that could be used as a small classroom.
- OM 315, Beavers on Business room, could be used for a small classroom. This room is typically reserved for the CoB student organizations and has their materials in the file drawers. The student organizations typically meet on TR 12:30 2:00. If the students have first access to the room it could be used for a classroom.
- Please DO NOT schedule any classes in the Slaaten Board Room. The room is used regularly for meetings and shouldn't be turned into a classroom

Office spaces – send those to me if you haven't already. Currently I have the following:



- Model Hall:
- o 110 could be 2 offices
- o 206 needs cleaned out; could be 2 offices
- o Third floor faculty offices: 311 (maybe; currently DCB employee), 312, 314, 315, 316,
- o 320 & 305 smaller storage rooms in the faculty area
- Library: 8 available study carrels with windows and two without windows, for a total of 10 carrels
- Old Main:
- o One in social science (Old Main second floor)
- o 301H, 301J, 315A, 315B, and 315E all empty; 302J (currently storage
- Questioned asked where will the office furniture be housed/held?
 - o Dakota Hall could be great cold storage area place items in room with faculty name on door.
- Theatre has a lot of theatre items such as costumes, sewing machines, sets, wood etc. Where would these items be housed/held?
- Again it was noted that when bubble comes down to have it stored elsewhere. The old facilities building would be great for art to utilize.
 - o Figure drawing, computer graphics, broadcasting and art need a home.
- Questions asked if faculty personal items up to them to move. Brent stated yes>
 Other Ideas:
 - Are there any classes we might want to try online synchronous with no in-person version?
 - o Please remember to be mindful of the international students they need so many face-to-face classes per their visa requirements.
 - Use a dorm or basement student union space.
 - Move some or all BIT faculty next to the CS folks. Then maybe the whole 3rd floor west wing of Old Main could house Comm or Art or English.
 - Memorial has some underutilized spaces.
