New Electronic Processes in the Registrar's Office

The Registrar's Office has developed an electronic process for their paper form processing, which will be used during the COVID-19 crisis. **All emails must be sent via the Minot State email account.** Emails can be sent to any of the Registrar's Office staff.

Add form (to be used after April 7 for fall and summer):

- 1. The student emails the request to add to the instructor. The email must include the class subject, catalog #, class #, and credits.
- 2. The instructor forwards the student's email with their approval of the request to the chair.
- 3. The chair forwards the instructor's email with their approval to the Registrar's Office.

Overload form (to be used after April 7 for fall and summer):

- 1. The student emails the request to overload to their advisor. The email must include the class subject, catalog #, class #, and credits.
- 2. The advisor forwards the student's email with their approval of the request to the chair.
- 3. The chair confirms the student's cumulative GPA is above 3.0 and forwards email with their approval to the Registrar's Office.
- 4. If there are pre-requisites that are not met or other enrollment issues, the chair forwards the email to the corresponding chair to approve the override into the course.

Drop form (to be used after April 9):

- 1. The student emails the request to drop to the instructor. The email must include the class subject, catalog #, and class #.
- 2. The instructor forwards the student's email with their approval of the request to the chair.
- 3. The chair forwards the instructor's email with their approval to the Registrar's Office.

Course Completion Agreement (due when grades are due):

- 1. The student and faculty discuss the I grade option and assignments left to be completed, agree on the date, and grade to change to if work is not completed.
- 2. The student emails the request for an I grade to the instructor. The email must include the class subject, catalog #, class #, assignments to be completed, date by which the work must be completed, and the grade to change to if work is not completed.
- 3. The instructor forwards the student's email with their approval of the request to the Registrar's Office.

Substitution Form:

- 1. The chair emails the student name; ID number; program area the substitution is to be applied to (major, minor, or concentration); institution of the course being subbed (either transfer school or MSU); substitution class subject, catalog #, and name; and the MSU class subject, catalog #, and name.
- 2. If the substitution is for Required Core or Foundational Content course, the request is emailed to the corresponding chair. That chair forwards the email with their approval to the Registrar's Office.

Early Registration – April 7-9

Early registration is almost here! Contact your advisees now to schedule a time to meet virtually to discuss plans for summer/fall semester! Encourage students to complete the following tasks prior to your appointment:

- a. View Enrollment Date/Time
- b. Review and take care of Holds
- c. Complete Financial Obligation Agreement



Students will login with their @ndus.edu email, open Microsoft Teams at the designated tutoring time and click on the appropriate session link. **All tutoring times are scheduled in Central Standard Time (CST)**.

Students should fill out the <u>Tutor Course Request</u> <u>Form</u> if they need assistance in a subject that is not listed or would like to request an alternative time. At least three students must request assistance in a particular course before the search for a tutor begins.

Designated faculty from each department/division will be advising new transfer students between April 20 -May 14. For those assisting, here are a few things to be aware of:

- Appointments set up in Starfish by April 14
 - Contact Tammy Wolf for Starfish questions/assistance
 - Take place over phone or via virtual appointment
- Students can begin registering on April 20
- Remove the Transfer Student Orientation and/or Advisor Hold after April 19th AND after the student has been advised
 - Allows current students two full weeks to register before new students register
- Send student the link to the <u>New Student</u> <u>Orientation Guidebook</u>

ACCUPLACER

The Academic Testing Center at Minot State University is closed until further notice.

Because of the closure, we are not administering the ACCUPLACER writing and math placement exams. As we move into spring, the demands for these exams grow, and unfortunately, we have no firm date as to when we can resume testing.

The College Board and ACCUPLACER use a company called Examity to deliver remote and virtual exams. We are currently awaiting more information. However, as you can imagine, Examity has been overwhelmed, and they have currently suspended their live proctoring. They are trying to hire proctors, so they may return to live proctoring soon.

If all goes well, we will open again sometime in April, and continue all testing, including ACCUPLACER. It is in late spring and early summer that we experience high volume testing for ACCUPLACER, with incoming fall students and dual-credit students testing.

Guide to Virtual Advising

TWO OPTIONS FOR VIRTUAL ADVISING

Via Microsoft Teams

Instructions:

- Download Microsoft Teams to an iPad, laptop, or smart phone: https://teams.microsoft.com/downloads.
 - a. Click "Download."
 - b. Log in with your @ndus.edu email.
- 2. Email appointment information to the student.
- 3. Open Microsoft Teams prior to scheduled appointment.
- 4. Click on "Calls."
- 5. Select "Make a call."
- 6. Enter student's name.
- 7. Click on audio call or video callicon.

More information (available in Teams):

- 1. Click on "Teams" (main menu, leftside).
- Select "MiSU Microsoft Teams Help and Request Form."
- 3. View training videos, files, FAQs (main menu, top of screen).

Via Blackboard Collaborate Ultra

Instructions:

- 1. Create a new link in one of your current blackboard course shells.
- 2. Title it "Advising Sessions."
- 3. Leave as an "open end date."
- 4. Continue using the same link.
- 5. Send the link to your advisees.
 - Use during office hours or at a designated time.

Schedule advising appointments using Starfish:

Benefits of using Starfish:

- Decreases the number of emails needed to schedule appointment
- Provides students with detailed instructions for appointment
- Students receive automated confirmation and reminder emails

New to using Starfish:

Currently using Starfish:

- Update your meeting locations (see step 4 on page 4 on the Appointment Instructions link above).
 - Uncheck in-person, on-campus meeting type, and select an online option.
- If appointments were previously set up, edit each block of appointments in your Starfish calendar so the new meeting location is available.

If you would like assistance setting up appointments or if you have questions, please email Tammy Wolf.

Notifying students via email:

- 1. Confirm date and time of appointment (CST).
- 2. Remind student how the virtual meeting will take place.
 - a. Download the Microsoft Teams app: https://teams.microsoft.com/downloads.

 Login with your @ndus.edu email.

OR

- b. Send student the link to join meeting directly via Blackboard.
- 3. Assign students tasks, such as:
 - a. View Enrollment Date/Time.
 - b. Review and take care of Holds.
 - c. Complete Financial Obligation Agreement.
