Spring 2022 First-Year Experience Learning Communities

How Students Enroll

Students who need to enroll in a spring FYE should first meet with their advisor to determine which FYE is appropriate. A list of learning communities offered in the spring semester can be found at MSU - Spring 2022 First-Year Experience (FYE) Learning Communities (minotstateu.edu). After visiting with their advisor, students should submit the FYE Registration Form, which is available on the above website.

Repeating the UNIV 110

A stand-alone online 2 credit UNIV 110, Power of a Person, will be offered in the spring semester for students who are online only students and for those who did not successfully complete their initial attempt at the course. Students can also retake the UNIV 110 in another learning community, but they must take the course(s) linked to that UNIV 110, as well.

Lab Sciences for Student Athletes

If you are advising student athletes there are several things to keep in mind. The Biology and Chemistry departments have ensured morning science labs (Biology, Chemistry and Geology) are available early in the week. Please encourage your students to enroll in these early labs to avoid conflicts with practices and travel. If students procrastinate, they may lose the opportunity to enroll in these lab sections. Please advise your students that if at all possible, to take science related courses in their off-season in order to avoid conflicts with labs.

New eForms in Campus Connection

The process of submitting the Withdrawal Form and the Legal Name Change Request Form has changed and are now only available in Campus Connection.

To access either form, students will log into their Campus Connection account. From there students will click on the eForms GT tile. Students must ensure they not only save the form, but that they submit the form, as well.

Students who find it necessary to completely withdraw to zero credits must complete the Cancel/Withdraw to Zero Form in Campus Connection:

- 1. Log into Campus Connection.
- 2. Click the eForms GT tile.
- 3. Choose Cancel/Withdraw to Zero on the left.
- 4. Choose Minot State University in the dropdown box.
- 5. Read the information and click the Next button.
- 6. Complete the form and click the Submit button.

POWER Programs

The POWER Program has several events scheduled to finish off the fall semester. All events are limited to students who have been admitted to the POWER Program, with the exception of the Virtual Museum Tours which is open to all students. What Students Should Know About Title IX and the PVT Hold

All students, whether in person or online, need to complete the Prevention Education Training if they did not attend Welcome Weekend 2021. The training (Part 1) needs to be completed on an annual basis. To access the training:

Students must enter their @ndus.edu email address. They will have the option to return to the training site at a later time if unable to complete the courses in one sitting. Reminder emails will be sent until the required training is completed. All training is tracked and recorded electronically.

A PVT Hold is placed on students who did not complete the training by the deadline of October 23.






Viewing ASC Peer Tutoring Attendance

As an advisor, have you ever suggested that a student seek out tutoring services, and then wondered if they ever took advantage of the resource? Starfish now allows advisors to view student attendance at Academic Support Center peer tutoring sessions. To view this information:

- 1. Click on the student's name in your My Students tab, or use the search feature to search for the student and click on their name.
- 2. Click on the Meetings tab on the left of the student folder. Any meetings that the student scheduled in Starfish will show, including meetings with the advisor.
- 3. The meeting Reason will indicate the tutoring subject. If you click on the plus sign beside the Date/Time, you will see the actual check in and out time. If the student forgets to check out, the system will automatically check them out later in the evening.



PLEASE NOTE: This Starfish feature is only used for tutoring conducted through the Academic Support Center peer tutoring program. This does not include tutoring conducted elsewhere in the University, i.e., the POWER Center, the Writing Center, or the Mathematics and Computer Science Department.
