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Students must maintain continuous enrollment in the BFA program. Students seeking a hiatus must make a formal appeal in the form of a letter to the BFA Committee to extend the program. Enrolled BFA students must present their work annually at the Sophomore/BFA Review throughout the duration of the program. Failure to do so will result in the termination from the BFA program.

Transfers:

If a requirement is satisfied by a transfer course, note that fact by a check in the TR column and include in the student's file a course substitution form with all transfers noted and approved.

If a transfer student has completed the General Education requirements at another institution, they are still required to complete the Developmental Content portion of General Education at Minot State University. These courses can often be met from Equivalency transfer courses and/or Art major requirements.
