#### Fact Book 2003 Highlights

#### **Enrollment Trends**

- The official headcount at Minot State University is 3,825 students for the fall of 2003.
- This represents an increase of 200 students.
- Foreign students are enrolled from 18 countries including Poland, Zambia, Korea, Yugoslavia, Belarus, Bosnia, India, Venezuela, Botswana, Slovakia, Tanzania, Hong Kong, France, Finland, Nepal, Morocco, Nigeria, and Macedonia.
- MSU has an exceptionally high percentage of enrollment off applications with 76% enrollment for new freshman students and 81.5% enrollment for new transfer students.

#### Faculty Trends

• Overall, the average salary for MSU faculty was \$46,479.

#### MSU Degree Highlights

- The largest numbers of undergraduate degrees were awarded to students in Elementary Education, Criminal Justice, Management, Psychology, and Nursing.
- The largest numbers of graduate degrees were awarded to students in the Communication Disorders and Management programs.

#### MSU Finance

- Grants and Contracts awards have increased each year for the last seven years.
- Scholarships and fellowships increased by 7%.
- Of the 2,355 students who made financial aid applications, 97.49% received some type of funding.
- Minot State University's tuition is lower than the regional and national average.
- It costs \$9,358 per FTE student for core services, support services, student aid, administration, and physical plant.

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




Head Count (HC) Enrollment and Full Time Equivalent (FTE) 1999-2003


# **Enrollment by Classification** Fall 2003


# **Enrollment by Full Time/Part Time Status Fall 2003**



### **Enrollment by Full Time/Part Time** Status and Gender: Fall 2003








# Enrollment by Residency Status\* 1999-2003


## Enrollment by Ethnicity\* 1999-2003
