• Quality Initiative final draft is currently being reviewed before submission; first draft of Criterion 2 and 3 are written and are now under review for evidence; our master of science in sports management has been submitted to HLC for approval

4. President's report

- Everyone is encouraged to attend the MSU Luau tonight at the ND State Fair beginning at 5:00 in the Flickertail Gardens
- Thank you to all that participated in the ND State Fair Parade last Saturday; we had an excellent showing of student athletes as well as faculty and staff
- Andy Carter, Athletic Director, will begin his duties on Monday
- We received very good news at last week's Challenge Grant meeting in that we received an additional \$482,000 to help with student scholarships; this also represents the remainder that was available this year so no other institutions will be able to get extra dollars once they reach their match; new funding will be available after the first of the year
- Trinity Health is extending their partnership with the MSU nursing department so look for an important announcement in the near future
- DCB's chief financial officer has submitted her resignation so J. Watson is there today as we will be helping them during this transition
- Beaver Lodges will soon be gone; all approvals are in place and a company has been identified that will take them
- Thank you to all that have helped with the Connect sessions; positive numbers for incoming freshmen
- Thank you to the BRC and the deans who have put so much time into budget recommendations; the ND Legislature will be holding their special session next week to discuss budget shortfall so we should know at that time if there will be another allotment; speculation is that it is possible there could be another 2.5% requested of state agencies; 2017-19 budget is at 90% and will need to be submitted by the end of August; meetings with OMB will take place in October to fine tune line items; we do face challenges in meeting the legislative mandate for cuts and although our last resort in meeting budgets is to let people go, it is a reality; be assured that there is very specific procedures in place that we must follow if we choose this option
- We did sign a Resolution Agreement with the Department of Education regarding the Title IX issue; we will be closely monitored and various reports will need to be submitted; one major component of the Agreement involves training so be aware that this will be required of all faculty, staff, and students
- Presented to the SBHE in June about our GrowND plan; no decision as yet
- Will be traveling to Turtle Mountain Community College tomorrow with L. Geller, V. Michels, and A. Mennem to discuss the addiction studies program

VPSA – enrollment-wise, we are down about 95 total headcount, however, first year numbers look very promising; Jess Dozier, new Sodexo District Manager, was introduced to the group

VPAF – BRC meeting was scheduled to meet this week but will now wait until after the special session next week; D. Epperson will be on maternity leave starting tomorrow so please be patient with requests

IR – should have the final tweaks made to the Dashboards and then they will be up and running; course evaluation reports will go out on August 2

VPAA – have about 20 new faculty that will be here for orientation on August 15 & 16; have been busy preparing for next term

Registrar – grade rosters for summer term opened today; finals are today and tomorrow and grades are due to be entered by August 8; R. Ringham will be attending Starfish and PAR training in Grand Forks next week; Campus Connection had

a major update over the weekend and in order to avoid any problems, clear out your browser cache before using – instructions will be forthcoming; Registrar's office is closed all day tomorrow for a staff retreat

Arts & Sciences - many meetings with chairs to go over the budget concerns; Summer Theater had another successful run

POWER – had SI trainer here which was very helpful; have renewed the contract with Go2Knowledge, an on-demand training service that anyone on campus can use; everyone is encouraged to check out what is available at www.go2knowledge.org and if you want to view a workshop or webinar, contact POWER for login instructions; the YMCA is hosting an "I Can Bike Camp" during the first week of August and is looking for volunteers

Student Success Center - office has been busy holding Connect Sessions and is now preparing for fall term

Student Center/Activities - homecoming parade float requests will go out soon; have been busy getting ready for fall term

Publications & Design – will be sending out the annual request for bulk order of stationary and envelopes; we can save substantial money by ordering in bulk; directories will be updated in August; President's Report will be mailed soon with a Connections magazine published in November

Sodexo – summer was busy working on new menu ideas for all dining venues on campus; very excited to offer more variety; will also have some new items in the C-store

Marketing – thank you to all who have volunteered to work the MSU booth at the Fair; as always we need stories for publications; finishing up the view book and should have that out soon; working on a refresh for the MSU home page; have reached out to the Chamber to offer campus tours once a month for community members; Alumni event in Bismarck on August 16 and everyone is invited to attend

Ed & HS – several meetings with chairs regarding budgets; have had a couple of new hires

Financial Aid – thanks to those who attended the Financial Aid training held earlier this summer; still very busy with FAFSA; this is the time of year there are many reports that need to be completed so staff has been busy with that

CoB - have had many scheduling changes due to budget restrictions; working on Strategic Plan rollout at Convocation

Veterans Center – looking into the VET training on campus; starting a mentoring program; very close to final plans for a 9/11 event on campus; starting a "Vets Welcome Home" event this year as part of homecoming activities

Enrollment - office continues to process applications as quickly as they can; recruiters are planning for next year

Bookstore - working on online book orders; will price match only during the first week of school – after that will be determined on an individual basis; working with Student Activities on hosting a VIP night for students this fall; the bookstore does have an app that you can download and use – gives you 25% off on merchandise

Grad School - finalizing thesis review for August conferral

HR – working with SVSIP; reviewing employee's classification and pay relative to the overtime law changes coming; will be digitizing HR; will be at DCB on August 18 to support their needs

DCB – D. Davis is the AD and football coach; received two grants from the US Department of Agriculture; Fall Term In-Service will take place the week of August 15; DCB has decided to get the Starfish program; nursing program received a state endowment grant of \$147,000; looking for an instructor for accounting

NDCPD – staff has been busy writing year-end grant reports which detail how the grant was used; have partnered with Belcourt the past 7 months on an Early Headstart Program and we will continue next year; NDCPD has been asked to attend a Medicine Moon Health Event in August in Belcourt; need to write a new five-year plan/application; thank you to whoever authorized the painting of the walls in Memorial – it has been such an improvement

Security – ND Risk Management has offered a 15% discount to state agencies if they meet a set amount of criteria so MSU will be working on a proposal; there are new risk management reporting forms online and an announcement will go out to campus today

Housing – we have contracted with a company to provide laundry services to the residence halls – no longer coin operated machines; have also contracted with a refrigerator company so students will be able to rent or buy a refrigerator; room assignments went out on July 13; we are down 130 applications this year and are sitting at about 70% occupancy; all lounge furniture is now replaced; summer to fall transition will take place this weekend; halls open on August 20 at 9:00 a.m. and all are encouraged to help our students move into their rooms

International Programs – working with new incoming students; changing the name of the orientation to International Students F1 Workshop to avoid confusion of it being a regular Connect session; Trinity will also be here for this session to conduct blood draws (TB testing) and student health will offer their services as well; refreshing a lot of publications to use for recruitment; working on the annual J1 report which does not change much from year to year

Facilities - construction has begun on the seasonal dome for Parker field

ITC – email conversion is moving along and should be done by August 13; e-waste collection has netted about 20 pallets and will end on August 1; working with a new imagining system; upgrading labs to Windows 10; willing to offer faculty training on technologies in the classroom

Honors - to date, there are 25 new students in the program; busy contacting current students and planning for fall

GBO - getting ready for fall; librarians plan to do more outreach to faculty in the coming year
