2. HLC

- Four of the five criterion have submitted a draft copy that L. Cresap is editing; these will then be forwarded to the VPAA for additional review
- HLC site visit is October 2017

- The SBHE meeting will take place via IVN in Administration 359 starting at 8:30 a.m. There will be one hour for public comment relating to policy 605.3 which addresses the amount of time an institution has to give to a tenured faculty when terminating employment proposal is to go from a 12 month notice to 90 days
- MSU has a Film Study Minor on the SBHE agenda for approval.
- Governor Burgum released his budget recommendations on January 16, 2017 some items to note:
 - Increase the higher education challenge grant from \$3M to \$10M
 - Eliminate all wage increases for state employees
 - o Proposal to have state employees pay a portion of their health insurance premiums
- These need to go before the ND Legislature before anything is finalized
- Minot State presented before the Senate Appropriations Committee on January 16. Did request permission to complete the following projects with no additional funding needed:
 - Renovation of lower level of the Gordon B. Olson Library to complete the NW Art Center
 - Complete the air supported dome over the football field
 - o Complete the facility building north of the Dome

Power – two webinars will be held in the Power Center – on February 1 at 1:00 will present "Mindset, Right to Fail, and Persistence: Academic Advising to Support Student Success"; on February 2 at 11:00 "Rethinking Retention: Elevating College Retention Rates" will air; these are open to anyone who would like to attend

Student Success – a graduation reception was held for students who graduated in December; "100 Days to 2017 Commencement" begins February 1

International – welcome K. Anderson as the new Study-Aboard Coordinator in the International office.

Human Resources – HR is moving to automation such as hiring, onboarding (coming soon), and background checks; contact Marc if there is any training that needs to be done

Financial Aid – disbursement of excess financial aid is today; February 15th is the deadline for general scholarship applications

Veterans – 91st Fifth Bomb wing visited the MSU campus on January 9; VFW awarded two \$500 scholarships; the 343rd squadron from Fargo was on the MSU campus January 24

Marketing – Rick Heit produced a video for Facebook and the MSU website; photo shoot for MSU students will be held soon

A & S – a former MSU student had a play accepted into the Kennedy Center American College Theater Festival held in Des Moines, IA; kudos to L. Cresap on the HLC progress

DCB – As of January 23, enrollment is up about 7% compared to last spring; FTE enrollment is also up about 7%; we think these numbers will hold as there are still some dual credit students needing to complete paperwork; DCB was recently named by the SR Education Group as one of the 20 most affordable accredited online community colleges in the country; community colleges considered in the ranking must have an annual tuition rate of less than \$5,000 and offer at least 10 full online degrees; DCB has three programs showcased at the "CTE in the Memorial Hall at the State Capitol" which is currently underway this week

Title XI – A hold will be placed on student accounts until the Title XI training is complete; this is an online training session; additionally all faculty and staff must also completed training on an annual basis

EHS – nursing accreditation passed the review and in March should receive a seven-year reaccreditation; MSU at the mall for TEHP will be first week in April

Graduate School – received approval for the Sports Management graduate program from HLC; L. Cresap is the program director; graduate student count is up due to the 23 students from Poland in the managerial program; Advising Task Force – Starfish attendance report training will be on February 2 & 3; advisor of the year awards will be presented at the faculty/staff appreciation event

CoB – two new faculty have joined CoB - C. Fenner and N. Wald; the strategic plan next steps are being developed and will be shared with the campus at an open forum in February

Business Office – busy with students paying tuition and picking up excess financial aid checks; fraud training was 100% by December 31, 2016; have been assisting Dakota College at Bottineau with all business office responsibilities

CEL –if you have any ideas for College for Kids camps send them to CEL; working on the system wide implementation of Blackboard

Native American Center – A. Mennem attended the funeral for law enforcement officer, C. Azure on January 24; there were over 2,000 people in attendance including over 350 officers from around the state and country; will be doing some recruiting in MT in the coming weeks; will hold fundraisers in February and March

Diversity Committee – to celebrate Black History Month we will be sponsoring a Martin Luther King, Jr. writing contest and former MSU student Joe Davis will be on campus February 3 for a forum

Housing/Student Health – housing applications are online - new and returning applications can be submitted through Campus Connection; next year we will have two living and learning communities (Wellness and Leadership); housing is losing their graduate student assistant; RA interviews will begin in February

IR – 2010 six-year cohort graduate rate was 42% we are now at 43%; thank you for all the updates for the fact book

Library –received a \$6,200 grant for new books.

ITC – everyone has migrated over to the NDUS email system

Enrollment – Recruiting for fall FY18 and still filling MHS dates; Spring open house - April 22; up in all applications

VPAA – Board of Regents nominations are due April 3; thank you to the Deans and Chairs for working so diligently on the budgets; thanks to B. Odahlen and K. Tyler for working and revising the orientation process; any ideas regarding budget should be forward onto any BRC committee member
