- Welcome K. Forde (AD) and M. Backen (DCB) to cabinet
- Have hired Dr. Carmen Simone as the new Dean for DCB her first day is August 15; she is a ND native (Watford City); has an extensive career in two-year colleges
- Several searches are taking place in athletics
- Next week is a big week with new faculty orientation taking place on Monday and Tuesday; Convocation on Wednesday; moving students in Friday – Sunday. All are encouraged to help with moving student into their halls
- August 22 we will hold our Student Convocation at 11:00 in Nelson Hall encourage everyone to attend. This will be followed up with a BBQ open to all faculty, staff, and students
- Attended the Chancellor's Cabinet retreat last week; focus was mainly on the upcoming legislative session to begin in January; there has been a lot of turnover in the legislature, in particular with long standing leadership positions this may impact decisions made during the session

- Was asked to testify at a hearing of the Acute Psychiatric Treatment Committee, an interim committee of the legislature, they are looking at residential care facilities in the state and whether or not we have enough due to the increase of mental health issues. We were asked because of the programs we offer and the expertise we have concerning this issue

HR – hired an HR coordinator, Paul Cerbone – stop by and introduce yourself; currently working on auditing files; developing a training session for the hiring process; will have a session on August 19th and will be open to campus for HR issues
