Advancement – thanks to everyone who helped with Homecoming; all events hosted by the Alumni Association were very well attended; we submitted \$1.4 million for the Challenge Grant application; on Sunday we will have Bravera Day at the soccer games – women play at noon, tailgate after that, and then men play at 3:00; thanks to those who organized the Severson Panel discussion this week; 52 people are going on the Alumni Rhine River cruise in October

ASC – have had good traffic in the center; seeing more students earlier in the semester than we have had in the past

Power – have been manning information tables at various places on campus to raise awareness; has helped get more students signed up for services

Financial Aid – Academic Excellence Scholarship - must be a new first year freshman student with U.S. or Canadian citizenship admitted to Minot State Summer 2024 or later; Full admission acceptance to Minot State by Feb. 15 for fall applicants; New freshman students who start in the summer semester will be evaluated and awarded with the following fall semester applicants; A student fully admitted to

Minot State after the priority deadline may be eligible if funding is available; Unweighted high school GPA; Transfer students are not eligible for the Academic Excellence Scholarship; still learning about the FAFSA simplification process

Athletics Outreach – thanks to all for helping to make this Homecoming successful; on September 30 we will celebrate Energy Day at the football game – already have 14 businesses signed up offering food; Ag Day will be on October 14

Publications – final proof of the directory is this Friday; anyone wishing to have a hard copy please contact University Communications

Alumni – still wrapping up a few things from Homecoming week; planning for travel events with trips to Denver, Florida, and Arizona; looking at more family events (pumpkin patch, Discovery Center, etc.)

Registrar – final enrollment numbers went out this morning; will be opening Spring registration next week

Enrollment – have hired two new staff; will focus on Canadian recruiting; Future Palooza brought over 600 students to campus

Security – have a new fingerprint machine; will be conducting fire drills next week

Housing – have a new hire to handle residence life; applications for spring and fall will open next week; we are up with students in the halls from this same time last year

Military – participated in various events; will be a part of the Veterans Stand Down event

IT – Hartnett tour on Friday at 2:00

Student Center – have been super busy with the start of school and Homecoming; had over 500 students at the bingo event; working on secure door access
