Our graduation ceremony went very well. We honored 790 graduates and highlighted Amy Leonard as a distinguished alumnus speaker and Jacey Peterson as our student speaker. Thanks to the many people who work hard to coordinate, plan, and facilitate this event. This is one of the highlights of our year.

# Capital Project proposals

Capital Projects will be presented at the June SBHE meeting. We plan on requesting funding to expand the geothermal system as well as funding for a new facilities management building.

# Discussions regarding an art facility

I recently met with three art faculty and Dr. Koczon to continue our discussion about the use of the maintenance facility and boiler plant for a renovated art facility. We discussed the original plans drawn up a few years ago by an architectural firm. From the beginning this use of that facility has depended on completing the geothermal system and taking all utility boilers off line. With the changes in the plans for geothermal, we considered the potential for the remaining natural gas boilers to coexist with the art facility. The art faculty will discuss the original plans and consider the needed square feet available, the renovation of the supply building, and other uses of that facility. This move would depend on moving ahead with the plan to relocate the maintenance facility to the north of the campus.

# Walter Piehl Art Gallery

Marv Semrau, Terry Jelsing, Walter Piehl and I met to discuss preliminary needs for the gallery, the space required, and potential locations. Mr. Jelsing, who has been involved in the development of other galleries, brought ideas and schematics of a gallery. We will continue to investigate the size of the gallery, the potential costs, fund raising, and locations.

# Wellness Center

The Center is nearing completion. The climbing wall has been installed and the contractors are now in the final stage of finish work. It is anticipated that the facility will be open for public viewing in early

#### Board of Regents meeting

The spring meeting of the Board of Regents included the recognition of the Board of Regents Achievement Award recipients, reports from the faculty, staff, and student senate presidents, a university report, and a focused meeting to discuss the renovation of Herb Parker press box facility and the Dome renovation. The regents were asked to work in small committees to discuss the projects and potential solutions for completing the projects.

#### Employee Recognition Luncheon

Recently our campus held our annual appreciation luncheon and recognized employees for their years of service and the Board of Regents Achievement Award Recipients. The event included a good meal provided by Sodexo and an enjoyable time to recognize others for their work for Minot State University. The coordinating committee did a great job organizing and planning the event.

#### Powwow

Our Cultural Center and the Native American Student Club organized a wonderful celebration in the Dome recently. Dancing, drum songs, special events to honor Veterans and graduates, a special feast and other fun events made for another successful event on campus. Thanks to our students and Annette Mennem for a job well done.

#### Early Retirement

To meet our budget reduction goals this year, we decided to request that faculty consider an early retirement incentive. Approximately eight faculty and staff decided to take advantage of this opportunity.

### **Budget**

Budget supervisors have been working with our Administration and Finance Office to meet the objectives to reduce our base budget by 3% this year and next year. The supervisors have been identifying areas that could be reduced, positions not to renew, and other cost saving steps. While the final details are not yet available, I have been told that we are well on the way to reach that objective this year. Thanks to all who worked hard to assist us in reducing our budgets.

### Earth Day

Our campus and our Sustainability Committee hosted another successful event in honor of Earth Day. A campus clean-up was undertaken by faculty, staff, and student volunteers, and presentations were made in the Beaver Dam to the Earth Day participants on water quality and conservation. I also participated in the Dakota College at Bottineau Earth Day event. Will Weaver, a short story writer, spoke to the community and campus and the following day a conference was held including a number of concurrent sessions dealing with environmental issues. I introduced the writer and welcomed participants to the conference.

#### **Developmental Leave**

In June I will be taking a 30-calendar day leave to pursue professional development objectives. Under SBHE Policy 701.2, the State Board allows presidents to propose and take a leave every five years. My proposal identified scholarly texts and potential writing projects to begin during this leave. Dr. Jenkins will be working with the members of President's Staff to provide leadership in my absence.

#### Interim Higher Education Committee meeting

The last Interim Higher Education Meeting was held for two days in Bismarck recently. The focus of this meeting was on the DSU audit report and other reports from the NDUS. I provided a report on waivers at the four-year schools and responded to questions.

#### New Chancellor

Dr. Hamid Shirvani will begin his work as the new Chancellor on July 1. He has already attended State Board Meetings, and intends to participate in the SBHE retreat in May. He pledged during his candidacy to visit the campuses and work to improve communications with individual campuses.

#### Strategic Enrollment Management Retreat

We recently held a full-day retreat to review enrollment patterns, examine the CRM program, look at the institutional research on enrollment and retention data, and consider various projection models. Scholarships, the Grow North Dakota initiative, the use of waivers, housing, and other related topics were considered to determine how we may improve enrollment and recruitment. The Noel-Levitz plan and other documents were reviewed. Based on that retreat, our institutional researcher is now working to develop more sophisticated projection models to include all the major areas impacting enrollments (e.g., on-campus, Bismarck, the MAFB, on-line, IVN, dual credit and others).

#### Enrollments

Application numbers are reportedly strong. Transfer numbers are increasing, and other categories of enrollments appear to be showing growth. Last year's application numbers, too, were very strong, but did not yield a high rate of residents because of the flood and the uncertainties of housing. We are focusing our attention on this critical need for our students.

#### Housing

Our residence life office and vice president for student affairs have been compiling data to look at trends of residency in each of our halls. The numbers in our halls remain strong. The Beaver Lodges, too, are now reporting strong numbers. Our residence life office is also compiling information on off-campus housing to provide to interested students. We are working very hard to make sure that all students needing housing will be accommodated either by on-campus housing or off-campus facilities.
