- * Nursing courses can begin in the Fall or Spring. NURS 363, NURS 383, NURS 483 are prerequisites for NURS 493 and NURS 457.
- ** Special Topics Courses can be taken before, during, or after nursing courses. Choose two from the following: HMS 333 Transcultural Healthcare (offered in Fall, Spring, and Summer), HMS 460 Quality and Risk Management in Healthcare (offered in Fall), and HMS 463 Issues in Healthcare Regulation and Professional Practice (offered in Spring).

Minot State University is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission, a regional accreditation agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education (hlcommission.org).

RN to BSN Online (BSN Completion Program) admission requirements

- 1. Admission to Minot State University.
- 2. Meet with the RN to BSN Program Director in the Department of Nursing.
- 3. Complete an application to the RN to BSN program.
- 4. Minimum GPA 2.75 on 4.0 scale.
- 5. Graduated from a board-approved nursing education program and have passed the NCLEX-RN.
 - Conditional admission if in the last semester of a nursing program before graduation.
 - Students that have not passed their NCLEX-RN may be conditionally admitted the first semester of the program and may take the following courses:
 - i. General education courses if needed
 - ii. Required statistics support course if needed
 - iii. NURS 363 Nursing Theory and Research
 - iv. NURS 383 Professional Nursing I
 - v. Special topics course(s)
- 6. Submission of all required health and safety documentation in the approved format.
- 7. The nursing program courses and required support course(s) must be successfully completed with a grade of C or above to progress in the program.

Graduation requirements

- Minimum GPA 2.0.
- 60 semester hours (SH) completed at a four-year institution. (NCLEX-RN credit of 35 SH will be posted in the final semester in the program, going towards this requirement).
- 30 SH taken at Minot State (23 SH nursing and special topics courses and 7 SH electives, general education, or statistics courses).
- Graduation application submitted to Registrar's Office.
