Articulation Agreement Between Nueta, Hidatsa, Sahnish Community College & Minot State University

This Articulation Agreement (the “Agreement”) is entered into by and between Minot State University (MiSU) and Nueta Hidatsa Sahnish Community College (NHSCC), each individually a “Party” and collectively the “Parties”. This Agreement shall have an effective date (“Effective Date”) as of the last signature received.

The Parties wish to collaborate to facilitate the transfer and degree completion of students earning the Bachelor of Science (B.S.) with and Addiction Studies Major from MiSU to the Associate of Arts Degree at NHSCC. This Agreement will ease transfer of students seeking a B.S. degree in Addiction Studies. The Parties enter into this Agreement in the spirit of cooperation and mutually recognize each other as quality postsecondary institutions.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

The following information pertains to the 2022-2023 MiSU catalog. Students satisfactorily completing the NHSCC courses below may transfer them to MiSU in fulfillment of the corresponding course requirements for the MiSU Addiction Studies degree. Students will complete their **AA or AS from Nueta Hidatsa Sahnish Community College. The student will be considered general education complete and will only need to complete the other requirements for graduating from MiSU with a B.S. in Addiction Studies.** Students planning to transfer to MiSU are encouraged to have phone or e-mail contact with an adviser from MiSU. Graduation with an MiSU's Addiction Studies degree requires completion of major requirements and a cumulative GPA of 3.0 in the required major courses. Students must complete 60 credits from a four-year university and 30 credits from MiSU to graduate.

After the students graduate with the BS degree from MiSU, they must complete 960 hours of training with one of the state's consortiums. The training can be undertaken during the student's matriculation at MiSU. Once their course work is complete, they become eligible to take the licensure exam. Once they pass the licensure exam and successfully complete the training hours, they are eligible to become a Licensed Addiction Counselor (LAC).

Admission to MiSU. The MiSU processes & considerations for evaluating applicants will be followed for admission. It is agreed that those students who receive the Associate of Arts or Associate of Science from NHSCC and meet MiSU admission criteria will be accepted without further review at MiSU to the Addiction Studies major. However, final admission to MiSU is contingent on submission of the student's application.

Review & Termination. The term of this Agreement shall be for two years, beginning on the "Effective Date." The Parties agree to review this Agreement and the Program once during this period at a time mutually convenient for the Parties but aiming for during the year prior to the end of this agreement's term. Notification of revisions to MiSU current and anticipated course offerings will also be sent to NHSCC during the above review period. A Letter of Review will be sent between 30 and 60 days prior to contract expiration to ensure both parties can continue to fulfill the terms of this agreement or if contract revisions may be required. This Agreement can

be terminated by either party by giving written notice to the other party's designated representative at least 60 days prior to the commencement of a new academic semester.

Notices. All notices concerning this memorandum of agreement and understanding shall be in writing and will be considered to have been given at the time of receipt of notice by the other Party
