### REPORT HIGHLIGHTS

The information for this report was collected through mail surveys, follow-up telephone calls, and inquiries to academic departments. The office of Career Services surveyed students who received degrees from MSU for the terms ending in December 2004, May 2005, and August 2005. This report is based on responses from 485 graduates (95% of the reported 510 degrees granted).

**Of the 485 respondents:**

--432 (89%) reported entering the job market.

--53 (11%) reported "Additional College."

**Of the 432 respondents entering the job market:**

--306 (71%) reported "Employed in Major" or "Employed Related to Major."

--18 (4%) reported still "Active in Job Search."

--Graduates reported accepting employment in 34 states and 2 foreign countries.

--295 respondents reported accepting employment in North Dakota.
