Early Entry (Dual Credit) and Academic Testing Center

The Fall 2017 semester has early entry (dual credit) enrollments of 181 students and 224 course enrollments. High schools offering dual credit classes with MSU this semester include Minot High, Bishop Ryan, Des Lacs-Burlington, Glenburn, and Surrey. A few students from Our Redeemer's Christian School participate in dual credit classes on the Minot High campus. Early Entry enrollment also includes area high school and home schooled students who are taking regular classes on the MSU campus. In 2017, the ND legislature (SB2244) allocated funds to support instructors who teach dual credit courses to meet Higher Learning Commission credential requirements. An instructor who participates in the program is entitled to receive a credit-for-credit voucher for high school classes with four or more students receiving dual credit for that course. The vouchers may be used toward tuition to take masters level courses at ND colleges and universities. The Academic Testing Center continues to provide proctoring and placement testing for students, and offers professional certification testing for students as well as the general community. The Academic Testing Center has integrated testing previously done by other departments on campus; including TEAS for nursing students, ACT Residual, Law School Admissions Test (LSAT), and group placement testing during connect sessions. Test Center hours are Tue-Fri, 8am-4pm (some Monday appointments available). Appointments are recommended for testing and can be made by calling Thomas Rakness, Test Center Manager, at 858-3830 or emailing msu.testing@minotstateu.edu. Testing is also provided at the MAFB Education Center one day each week. Military service members can make appointments for CLEP and DSST testing using an online scheduler at askmsu.com/ clepmafb.

Minot State University on the Bismarck State College Campus



MSU @ BSC provides four undergraduate degree programs and two online undergraduate degree programs.

The courses are instructed in a variety of format, which include, face-to-face on the Bismarck State College campus, via the IVN network and online.

Mike Wardzinski, Criminal Justice Advisor/Instructor is currently advising 22 students for the fall 2017 semester. In addition to the traditional courses instructed in the classroom, he will be instructing his spring courses over the IVN network. The Criminal Justice Program has one student scheduled to graduate at the end of the fall 2017 semester and three students are on track to graduate at the end of the spring 2018 semester. Mike is also the Representative for Minot State University on the Bismarck State College Criminal Justice Advisory Committee, which meets with representatives of local criminal justice agencies. Mike is a licensed Peace Officer by the North Dakota Peace Officer Standards and Training Board. During the last academic year, Mike has attended training to include the School Safety Conference conducted by the National Association of School Resource Officers, Elder Abuse Investigation conducted by the North Dakota Bureau of Investigations, Tactical Leadership, Tactical Traffic Stops conducted by Calibre Press, Ethical Decision Making conducted by Gordon Graham, and the 2017-2018 North Dakota Legislative Law Update.

The Social Work Department has a new Program Director. Nancy Gordon (MSW/LCSW) joins us after 12 years of employment as the Mental Health Counselor at Bismarck State College. She currently has 33 advisees in Bismarck and looks forward to bringing more students into the program by offering SWK 250 Interpersonal Skills on the Bismarck Campus. SWK 250 is a required pre-requisite course offered face to face at BSC in spring semester 2018. Ten Bismarck students will graduate after completing the Field Education and Senior Seminar courses this fall semester and nine students will enter into these courses and graduate in spring semester 2018.
