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Minot State University Student Nurses Immunization and TB Requirements

Prior to S1, it is your responsibility to upload all of the immunization and TB requirements required by your clinical sites to the MSU Student Health Portal. Failure to comply may result in a student HOLD or disallow you to participate in clinical practice or attend class. Instructions to upload are below.

PRIOR TO SEMESTER 1

Provide MSU Student Health with documentation of these vaccinations and TB testing through the MSU Student Health Portal (see instructions below).

If you have had a previous TB test in the past 12 months, you will only need one TB test; a second TB test will not be necessary. You must provide documentation of this. A TB blood test (IGRA, Quantiferon) meets the requirement for a 2-step TB Test. If you have tested positive for TB, upload documentation of TB treatment or chest X-ray results.

ANNUALLY AFTER SEMESTER ONE

Provide MSU Student Health with documentation of influenza vaccination (by Nov. 1st annually) and TB testing (annually, ex. If you received a TB test on 10-18-17 you should have your annual TB test done a week or two before the due date of 10-18-18). If influenza and TB testing are done outside of student health, upload to the student health portal.

Influenza Vaccination – These are available in the fall until the beginning of summer, nursing students should receive their influenza vaccination as soon as it is available and provide documentation to MSU Student Health Center through the MSU Student Health Portal

TB Testing - must be done no later than one year after the last TB test. If you had a blood test (IGRA, Quantiferon) done to rule out TB, this must also be repeated annually and submitted to MSU Student Health through the MSU Student Health Portal.

Instructions to Submit Documentation on the Student Health Portal

The required documentation must be submitted through the MSU Student Health Portal, **Student Health will no longer accept paper documentation submitted via fax, e-mail, mail, or hand delivery.** Once you have uploaded your documentation, student health nurses will verify that you are compliant with the requirements. This can be done by using your camera on your phone, take a picture, save to your desktop as a PDF and upload.

1. Access the MSU patient portal at <https://minotsu.medicatconnect.com/> to upload your required immunization and TB documentation electronically. (Use your campus connection user name and password to log in)
 - IMMUNIZATIONS or IMMUNE TITERS Go to Upload > Choose Document You Are Uploading > Immunization Record > Select File > Upload
 - TUBERCULOSIS TEST RESULTS Go to Upload > Choose Document You Are Uploading > Tuberculosis Test Results > Select File > Upload

Where can I get immunizations, immune titers, and TB testing?

TB testing, immune titers, and all required vaccines, **EXCEPT varicella vaccine**, are available at the Student Health Center. You can schedule an appointment through the MSU Student Health Portal <https://minotsu.medicatconnect.com/> (Use your campus connection user name and password to log in). All vaccines and TB testing are also available at First District Health Unit - 852-1376. Cost varies depending on your insurance.

Where can I get a copy of my immunization and TB records?

You can obtain a copy of your immunization records and TB results any time by going to the MSU Student Health Portal <https://minotsu.medicatconnect.com/> (Use your campus connection user name and password to log in) > Immunizations > Print. **This will show you the records we have for you.** If you are missing records, you should obtain copies from your local public health, or healthcare provider that administered your vaccines. You can also check with your high school.

How do I know if I am compliant?

Go to the MSU Student Health Portal <https://minotsu.medicatconnect.com/> (Use your campus connection user name and password to log in) > **Immunizations > Print.** What you will find is everything that our office has on file for you.

On this page under status, it will say compliant or not compliant. Review your record to determine what requirements you are missing or when you are due for your annual TB test. Student Health will send you a reminder when you are due for an immunization or TB testing or if you are not in compliance. Messages will be sent through a secure message to your email. Please do not ignore these e-mails. Failure to take action with these reminders may cause a student HOLD or disallow participation in clinicals or attend class.
