Arequipa (right). With a population of 900,000 it is the second largest city in Peru. Arequipa lies in the Andes mountains; the former snow-capped volcano El Misti overlooks the city.



Cuzco is the historic capital of the Inca Empire and was declared a World Heritage Site in 1983 by UNESCO. It is a major tourist destination and receives almost 1.5 million visitors a year.



Lima (above) the capital of, and largest city in Perú is an inexhaustible source of culture. Today, there are more than 8 million inhabitants, and is made of immigrants from all corners of the globe. Lima was founded by Spanish conquistador Francisco Pizarro in 1535, as la Ciudad de los Reyes, or "the City of Kings".

2. Apply by December 15, 2011*

Download an application from the website or request one by calling or emailing. If you do not already have a passport, now is the time to apply for one.

*Late applications might be accepted after December 15th, depending upon available space. Applicants who submit an application after this date are not guaranteed a spot and might be required to pay slightly higher program fee due to rate fluctuation in transportation costs. Rate increases are typically not significant.

3. Submit your Financial Aid Documents.

Visit the financial aid office and make arrangements for your summer financial aid package to help cover program expenses.



Please note: In order to be eligible for summer term financial aid, students must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 summer credits. At least 3 of these credits must be from NURS 496.

4. Attend Orientation Meetings. Study Tour participants are required to attend all pre-departure orientation sessions arranged by the faculty leader and the Office of International Programs.

Course Work

Participants of this study tour will be enrolled in **Nursing 496: Global Nursing Perspectives** (3 credits). The program will be led by Dawn Fredrich, MSU nursing instructor. Interpreters will be assisting during daily activities and local nursing faculty will coordinate healthcare experiences.

Program Fees

The program fee is all inclusive and covers: international flight, hotel, interpreters, and local transportation.

*For the cost of the mandatory international insurance policy, applicants 50-64 years of age at time of travel add \$100, and ages 65-74 years add \$250.

**Participants may choose to audit the course for 50% tuition rate. Financial Aid is not available for audited courses or continuing education units and grades will not appear on transcripts.

Financial Aid

Financial Aid can be applied to cover study tour fees, so students might want to consider the possibility of obtaining Financial Aid (generally including loans) to assist in funding their program.
