* If receiving U.S. financial aid, or applying for scholarships, you must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 credits to be considered full-time. Full-time international students must be enrolled in 9 credits per semester for visa status (until they have taken all classes, and may then continue to work on the thesis if necessary at less than full-time). It is recommended that international students start in either spring or summer semester, depending on their concentration, in order to most easily maintain full-time status. Most concentration coursework is offered during summer, and those schedules are available from the respective departments.
