Graduate Degree Credit Option

Teachers attending the Summer Institute receive \$1,300 tuition grant for the 6 graduate credits earned. Total cost to teacher is about \$500 in tuition and fees.

Graduate Workshop Credit Option

Teachers can earn 6 credits of 500 level graduate workshop course credit, which counts towards recertification, at no cost to the teacher.

Professional Development Option

Teachers can attend the workshop for continuing professional development without earning any credits at no cost to the teacher.
