## Graduation Requirements

The MSU Registrar's Office personnel officially review student transcripts for graduation requirements. All MSU and nursing requirements must be met prior to graduation. A minimum grade point average of 2.0 is required for all baccalaureate degree candidates.

The Bachelor of Science in Nursing for Registered Nurses is available in a flexible, convenient online format. The program offers clinical components in each nursing course. The clinical requirements are completed through a variety of individual assignments and the implementation of virtual public health and simulation scenarios incorporated within the N457 Public Health for the Professional Nurse course.

## BSN Completion Program Requirements for Admission

1. Complete an application to Minot State University.
2. Complete an application to BSN Completion Program, which includes a required criminal background check and proof of current/active, unencumbered U.S. RN license.
3. Request an appointment with the BSN Completion Program Advanced Standing Director, in the Department of Nursing, to review prior course work and to plan your program of study.
4. Students who have graduated from a board approved nursing education program and have passed the NCLEX-RN need to submit an application with the required documents to the Department of Nursing.
5. Students who have graduated from a board approved nursing education program, but have not yet passed the NCLEX-RN may take the following courses and may be conditionally admitted the first semester of the program.
  - a. General education courses
  - b. Required support course
  - c. NURS 363 Nursing Theory and Research
  - d. NURS 383 Professional Nursing I
  - e. Special Topics course(s)
6. Cumulative GPA 2.75 on a 4.0 scale.
7. Required with application: current U.S. unencumbered RN license, criminal background check form, fingerprint card(s), and check to ND Attorney General for designated amount; MSU immunization record; copy of personal health insurance coverage.

## Program Requirements

### General Education Courses (38 SH)

The general education model incorporates learning across disciplines and learning throughout an entire college career. Therefore, our general education courses should be taken both inside and outside of a student's major and should include both lower division courses and upper division courses. This way, essential skills, such as problem solving, critical thinking, and communication can be addressed from a variety of perspectives. This will help each graduating Minot State University student better adapt to the fluctuations of post-collegiate life in both their personal and professional opportunities.

The Minot State University General Education model has three components: Required Core, Foundational Content, and Developmental Content. The Required Core and Foundational Content require taking classes beyond a student's major. These courses emphasize studies in core academic areas such as english, mathematics, the arts and humanities, the physical and natural world, and history and social sciences. The Developmental Content emphasizes outcomes and are divided into three categories.

### Program Progression

The Nursing Program courses and statistics must be successfully completed with a grade of C or above to progress in the program.

### NCLEX Examination Credit

The NCLEX Examination Credit is part of the overall fee structure for students within the program. A course fee of \$250.00 is attached to four nursing courses (identified with a <sup>1</sup>) for a total of \$1,000.00. The examination credit validates the student's successful completion of the licensure exam. The examination credit allows progression in the program as we acknowledge your prior studies and successful licensure. The NCLEX Examination Credit is also designed to help you meet the graduation requirement of a minimum of 60 semester hours completed at a 4 year institution. Forty (40) semester hours will be posted on the official MSU transcript during the semester of graduation.
