
Add Audio to a Slide

- 1. In **Normal** view, click the slide that you want to add a sound to.
- 2. On the **Insert** tab, in the **Media** group, click the arrow under **Audio**.



- 3. Do one of the following:
- To add a sound from your computer or a network share, click Audio on My PC, locate the folder that contains the file, and then double-click the file that you want to add.
- To record and add your own audio, click **Record Audio**, and in the **Record Sound** box, click the **Record** button to begin speaking or playing your own audio.


The audio icon and controls appear on the slide.



4. In **Normal** view or **Slide Show** view, click the icon and click **Play** to play the music or other sound.

Preview Audio

On the slide, click the **Play/Pause** button beneath the audio icon.



Setting the Playback Options

- 1. On the slide, select the audio clip icon
- 2. Under **Audio Tools**, on the **Playback** tab, in the **Audio Options** group, do one of the following:
- To start the audio clip automatically when you show the slide, in the Start list, click Automatically.
- To manually start the audio clip when you click it on the slide, in the **Start** list, click **On Click**.
- To play an audio clip as you click through the slides in your presentation, in the Start list, click Play across slides.
- To play an audio clip continuously until you stop it, select the **Loop until Stopped** check box.

NOTE: When you loop a sound, it plays continuously until you advance to the next slide.

Hide Audio Icon

- 1. Click the audio clip icon .
- 2. Under **Audio Tools**, on the **Playback** tab, in the **Audio Options** group, select the **Hide During Show** check box.

This is important to do if you are planning to convert to a video file. Failing to do so will result in audio icons appearing in your converted video file.

Convert PowerPoint into Video File

- 1. Click File, then select Export from the menu on the left side of screen
- 2. Now click **Create a Video**. Create a Video option will appear

Set the options as follows:

- Presentation Quality
- Don't Use Recorded Timings and Narrations
- Set seconds spent on each slide time. 5 seconds is the default. This
 will only apply to slides that have no audio applied to them. Slides
 containing audio will display the duration of the audio recorded for
 that slide.
- Click **Create Video** to start the conversion process. A progress bar will appear at the bottom of the screen.

NOTE: Conversion time will depend on the number of slides and amount of audio contained in presentation.

| Windows Audio file | <mark>.wav</mark> |
| Windows Media Audio file | <mark>.wma</mark> |
