Using Modular Design

Modular design is based on the creation of "units" which focus on a central, related core of concepts or topics. The modular design also incorporates all of the resources necessary for students to successfully achieve its associated learning objectives. This includes:

- 1. The module learning objectives
- 2. All content (text-based, audio, video, etc.)
- 3. All assessments
- 4. All assignments
- 5. All discussions, bogs, wikis, etc.
- 6. Any special instructions for projects and assignment
- 7. Any module supporting materials

Students should not be forced to leave a learning module to complete any specific segment of the course.

Consistency between courses is essential. All module related materials should be located in the module, named appropriately, in a meaningful sequence. This will reduce student confusion, keep the course design consistent with other MSU courses, and simplify course navigation.
