## 3. Campus Parking

To address some of the parking issues, R. Kluck informed the Cabinet of the following changes:

- a. Lot C currently used as Admin/Student Center staff parking will be changed to Lot D and will be used for overflow parking from Cook and McCulloch Halls
- b. Unreserved parking outside of the Student Center will become Lot C for staff displaced from the original Lot C
- c. A new lot Lot O will be located behind the Dome and will be used by Dome personnel
- d. Lot L will be used for academic buildings in that quadrant of the campus

#### Discussion:

- a. if you have special needs as far as parking goes, please let R. Kluck or B. Foisy know
- b. people displaced from their regular lot due to a campus event will have shuttle service available to their vehicles in the Dome Lot
- c. AJ Automotive will not be available soon as demolition is set to begin to make way for the apartment/office complex going up
- d. if we close a lot due to a special event, can we open it again once that event begins
- e. for special events, could we put guests north of the Dome and shuttle them to the location on campus?
- f. we will be meeting with Augustana Lutheran Church and Bishop Ryan HS to see if we can work out some type of arrangements for additional parking
- g. please have a couple of spots by Lura for clinic parking so students that use the student services in the lower level of that building have a place to park R. Kluck will take care of reserving a couple of spots for Lura Clinic purposes
- h. should there be incentives offered for employees who carpool? This should be considered by the Sustainability Committee.
