VPAF – budget templates should be coming out in the next few weeks; looking into four-year scholarships to enhance recruiting and retention efforts; discussing shared services with DCB, DSU, and WSC

POWER – thanks to A. Heitkamp for his help with a student in tutoring; went camping at Cross Ranch to enhance bonding between students; diversity panels have been well attended; conducting interviews on Friday

Registrar – still have 27 rosters out for mid-term grading – urge faculty to get this done; on Friday Starfish attendance report will go out; assisted with writing a grant to enable Veterans benefit reporting

IR – dashboards are almost complete; 6 year graduation rate is at 42%; check IR website for more reports

Business Office – working with two new processes – a time labor absence module and a travel expense module – both should automate current system

Financial Aid – would like all departments to have scholarship applications available online so all are due at the same time

Marketing – Minot Area Chamber of Commerce met on campus yesterday – did have some members join in a campus tour after the meeting; November 17<sup>th</sup> is the annual Showcase of Business with a theme of Fairytale Favorites – working with D. Conn and education students to get our booth organized

International – Global sites photo contest submission deadline is this Friday; International Cultural Day will be on Thursday, November 17

DCB - Career Technical Education visit from the State went well

HR – lot of recruiting taking place; FSLA training announcements will be coming out soon – HR web site also has information relative to FSLA; implementing automated system for applications; still have many more options to automate processes through Oracle/PeopleSoft which will help with follow up and allow for more analytical review

Student Development – Health fair will be in the Atrium on November 3 from 11:00 – 1:30; have 390 holds that have been placed on student accounts for not meeting reporting requirements for immunizations; we have become a Healthy Campus 2020 partner; the Omicron Tau Honor Society will be hosting a drive to benefit the men's winter refuge

Alumni – everyone is invited to wear their "I Give" t-shirts the first Wednesday of each month; we are currently at 31% participation for faculty and staff

NDCPD – Friday and Saturday we will have the Consumer Advocacy Council on campus; B. Askvig just returned from Norway where he worked on collaborations with universities

Graduate – number of applications for spring are on track with previous year; waiting for final approval from SBHE on the managerial certificate; Advising Council will offer training on November 1 and 2.

CoB – have received a large number of people volunteering to assist strategic planning teams in setting action plans; have a new instructor in accounting; we need to prepare a report for our accreditation; we will participate in the International Case Study Competition in Regina

EHS – CAATE site visit coming up soon; commend all the health careers faculty who recently took part in the Health Career Fair – good comments from employers; looking at the college's strategic plan and revising to align with MSU's new plan; will be traveling to NDSU to meet on details of an MOU on the Leadership Academy; November 10<sup>th</sup> will bring the one act play competition to campus

IT – we have turned off the old link for email and now are completely under the new program; can now start using Skype for business; student email migration will take place the week after Thanksgiving

Student Life – regional conference is November 7<sup>th</sup> and this will be D. McCall's last year as committee chair; RHA has many events planned in the coming weeks (political panel discussion, haunted house, etc.)

Security – will be mandatory online training in January to enhance loss control; Cleary information has been submitted; emergency operating guides have been distributed, if anyone needs extras contact Security

Facilities – upgrading lighting around campus – should take place over the next 3 weeks; the former Beaver Lodge location has been turned into a parking lot for anyone to use

Library – D. Harvey retired last Friday; looking to update mission and strategic plan for the library

VPAA – thanks to R. Ringham and A. Heitkamp for their work in obtaining grant funds; Retention Committee met yesterday to continue their work from last semester; there is an Open Ed Resources meeting in Grand Forks next week and faculty are encouraged to attend
