- The higher education funding bill is usually one of the last bills to get legislative approval; legislators are hoping to wrap up the session by April 14th so it is likely that the house will finish their recommendations soon so that the bill can go before the joint committee to work out differences before April 14; with the latest revenue forecast it is unlikely that the House will make too many changes from the version they received from the Senate
- Another round of early retirements is being offered to faculty and staff who meet the qualifications; this will have some impact on the budget as well
- The BRC met yesterday and have submitted their budget recommendations to the President; hopefully
 we will have things finalized by May 1
- Had a meeting with Residence Hall Association members about an upcoming dodgeball tournament; it will take place this Thursday in the Wellness Center with registration beginning at 6:00; all are encouraged to participate

Registrar – open enrollment is taking place now; first day we had 618 enrolled; working on Commencement details

A&S – wrapping up the annual evaluation process; many end of the year events taking place – science open house, music fests, campus players competition, etc.; Minot Symphony is coming up on April 1; had a great recruiting trip to Williston this week

CEL – blackboard team was on campus to meet with faculty; training will take place this fall and all NDUS campus will be on the system in Summer 2018

Student Center/Activities – will be taking a group of students to St. Paul for the Campus Activity Conference in preparation for next year's campus activities; will host a comedian on April 4; students are working on an Earth Day project

Financial Aid – summer financial aid applications are available; March 27th department scholarships are due; staff are currently training to receive some national credentials

Publications/Design – Connections has been mailed; will start on President's Report; busy helping departments with all their end of the year publications

Alumni – on April 7 there will be a "Beavers, Brew & Burgers" event at JL Beers to celebrate Beaver Day and Beer Day – tickets are \$40; very few seats remain for the Gala so if you intend on going, contact the alumni office; the Alumni Facebook page launched on Monday; we are able to award over \$29,000 in scholarships; the board decided to award three 4-year scholarships as well

Student Health – things have settled down since the first of the year as upper respiratory cases have fallen off; the spring break trip to Haiti was very successful – thanks to all who donated items

Security – will be working with Ward County and Trinity on a simulated emergency situation – the event will take place on May 15th and it will involve a bleacher collapse at the Dome and how emergency response teams react

Enrollment – open house is on April 22; finishing up recruiting trips in Minnesota, North Dakota and Montana; during orientation sessions we will host an ice cream social – Pride Dairy in Bottineau has agreed to come up with an MSU inspired ice cream we just have to name it – it will not be available in stores; thanks to publications and design for all the work they have done in producing recruitment pieces

GBO – finalizing the last of the publications in the lower level; bids will go out as soon as the Governor signs the bill

VPAA – conducted training with chairs on PAR; made some dual credit changes to comply with NDUS policy; SPED is working on a symposium during homecoming week
