- the event wrapping up after 7:00 p.m. We appreciate him taking time to meet with faculty, staff, students, and community leaders to hear of our successes as well as challenges that we face.
- On January 30 and 31, the ND Interim Higher Ed committee will hold their meeting on the Minot State
 campus. They allow time for a campus update from the president as well as other presentations that we
 want to highlight. B. Askvig, V. Michels, and a student will be talking about their programs. R. Hedberg

3. Announcements/Acknowledgements

SA – we have received the recommendations from the consultant regarding dining services and they include: better access/expanded hours for students; run meal plans from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m.; rethink use of space in Beaver Dam and Buckshot's as well as the area right outside of the C-store. An RFP will be sent out and we are hopefully going to award a contract this spring yet.

DCB – enrollment is holding steady with a slight increase in dual credit and online; a graduate of our photography program is on a paid internship with Disney corporate; met with District 6 legislators on Monday; DCB Hockey plays MSU Hockey on January 30 in Minot

Athletics - home basketball games this weekend – looking forward to T. Rudolph scoring 30 more points to become the all-time leading scorer for MSU; between the men's and women's game on Friday, we will have a dedication ceremony and open house for the Dean Frantsvog Academic Success Center; have hired XC/TF coach

Advancement – NW Art Center is complete and is currently hosting an exhibition; 2017 calendar year was a record year of giving bringing in \$5.9M

University Communications – Inside went out last week; campus highlights (for alumni & friends) will go out this week; Connections will go out in March

Power – open position has been put on hold for the time being due to federal government uncertainties

Career Services – February 13 we will host a "speed interviewing" session; end of the month will be a Sophomore Supper

Student Center – hosted a Build a Bear event last night and had 205 participants; more activities next week

Alumni – hosting an appreciation night at basketball games Friday night – free food while it lasts; partnering with the MSO for their February 3 concert by providing appetizers for patrons; AZ alumni events will take place during the first week in March; we are currently at 40% of faculty and staff giving

HR – CUPA survey is completed; working with faculty senate salary/budget committee on equity issues; there will be some development opportunities for faculty and staff in the coming weeks – please encourage participation from your areas

Business office – tax forms have been released; tuition/fees are due today

VPAA – faculty ad hoc committee studying a pre-tenure review process; chairs working on syllabi uniformity; proposed at last NDUS VPAA meeting that we have an exception to a math model that student could take core credit course at the same time as a lab – NDUS institutions believe this should be implemented system-wide – will go to board for approval

Wellness - will host a self-defense class on January 30; a blood drive will be held on January 31

Veterans – will travel to Mayville later this week to help with veterans reporting; ND Veterans Affairs Commission wants MSU to work with U of Mary and BSC for an annual summit

AVPAA – teacher education very busy working on organizing evidence for the CAPE accreditation – site visit will happen in October

Honors – free babysitting on February 15 at 6:00 in the center

NDCPD – launched 3 new and 5 continuing projects; new spring grants are at 3 or 4 in progress

NA – powwow posters were distributed; diversity council is working on the following: Black History Month, Women in History month (March) featuring three women who made an impact on MSU; workshop on "Pronouns Matter"

CEL – almost complete with content review of online

Housing – have in increase in housing for spring; February 1 we go live for summer housing; hiring student staff for next year

Security – we are hosting State B Girls basketball in March; we have in intern working in security now – CJ Major

Registrar – non-attendance reporting is due; catalog changes due on March 1

GBO – reaching out to different offices to get up to speed where things were prior to director leaving

Title IX – working on Sexual Assault Awareness month events with student athletes

Marketing – a survey regarding branding will be coming out soon – all are encouraged to complete it; Be in the Know sessions coming up soon

Financial Aid – applications are due in February 15

Enrollment – February 10th is the spring Red & Green day featuring the College of Business; will be traveling to Max tomorrow evening for the basketball game – anyone interested in going along to hand out ice cream talk to K. Tyler; looking for ambassadors; orientation dates are set; up for fall applications
