- GPA of incoming FYR has steadily increased which promises a better chance at student success
- Biology and Nursing continue to show growth in enrollment

- MHS is our top feeder school; other area schools are graduating smaller classes but show good enrollment based on their smaller class sizes
- BSC leads our transfers from last school attended; DCB and WSC show good enrollment as well
- R. Ringham presented the official enrollment figures over the past several years.

GBO – lower level is completely cleared to make room for the academic center; thanks to facilities for all their help with this project

NDCPD – finishing up annual reports; A. Armstrong recognized for her work on ASPIRE project; H. Liccini and L. Garnes meeting with staff from Senator Cramer's office

Alumni – hosted another successful Gala; faculty and staff giving is now at 56% which is the highest it has ever been – thanks to all who participate; friends golf tours start in Velva on June 4; will host a social in Fargo later that same week; will once again be awarding people around town with a coupon for a Starbucks cake ball if they are wearing MSU gear

Communications – campus highlights out next week; president report deadline is middle of June; working on a communications style guide to help departments

Advancement – will conduct a capital campaign feasibility study; looking at fundraising this summer for Summer Theater renovations; will look at updates to Hoffman Auditorium and Nursing

Veterans – going through DoD review and reporting; will attend a meeting with NDUS and Veterans affairs office to work on survey of verifying services; Memorial Day event in the Veterans office Friday at 11:30 Flag day event on June 14

Security – fire alarm testing is taking place; in early June we will have a severe weather safety drill

ITC – summer is always extremely busy preparing classrooms and campus with upgrades, equipment, etc.; DUO change coming this summer; students will be required to use it in the fall

CEL – submitted two applications to CCAF; Grad school compliance review is complete

LCM – served over 7,000 bowls of soup last academic year; reorganizing the food pantry so it is ready for fall

Wellness – camps are coming up – have College for Kids the next two weeks

VPSA – interviewed five applicants for the housing director position – will bring two to campus; thank you to D. McCall for all his work in the housing department

Marketing – running campaigns for CJ online, Grad school, and urging students to apply; will hold web administrators training later this spring

International – the group that traveled to Norway will be back this weekend

Power – looking to fill an academic coach position

Bookstore – look for clearance items next week during orientation as well as overstock items

NA/Diversity – on June 7 will host 30 students from TMCC; we had 20 graduates this year; met with the Head Start director while recruiting in New Town and she is very interested in meeting with MSU on a cohort; thanks to all who helped with the powwow

Facilities – lighting project is almost complete; replacing some cooling towers; window upgrade project has started in Old Main

Registrar – Campus Connection will have a new look this summer – July 15

VPAA – have been successful in filling some vacant faculty positions; V. Pinnick is the newest Academic Hall of Fame recipient and she will return to campus this fall to be recognized; P. Lepp is now the chair for Biology and P. Markel is for addiction studies/psychology/social work
