Bookstore - digital courseware is expanding

Native American – will be recruiting at Ft Pierre, Custer, Pine Ridge, and Rapid City; have 136 self-identified NA students; open house tomorrow at 11:00; club officers are in place; will be attending and presenting at the National Indian Education Association Convention in Minneapolis next month

Wellness – currently have a position open to replace K. Stander; will be hosting the Chamber's leadership session tomorrow

Title IX – training is out for athletes; faculty and staff training out today – this is mandatory – if faculty and staff do not complete they will receive a letter in their personnel file – students will have a hold placed on their account until training is complete; Take Back the Nite is October 9 at 7:00 in the Beaver Dam; Edna Sailor will be the speaker and M. Spelchen will provide music

International – the agreement with Souris Basin Transportation has been very successful; will get word out to the general student population so anyone can ride; will offer a new summer study abroad option for Norway

LCM – collaborating with several different departments on campus; food pantry has been very busy; looking for gently used cold weather gear for students who have none – send over to the pantry

Financial Aid – disbursement was done last week; posters are up around campus for the V.J. Smith presentation on October 8; L. Benson was elected treasurer at the regional financial aid conference

Veterans – thanks for attending the Patriot Day event; worked on survey for all institutions in the NDUS – should be coming out soon; several groups coming to campus to help with students' questions

CEL – working on MOU with BSC, NDSU, and MAFB; graduate council will be starting up soon

HR – working on PeopleSoft upgrade

Security – good start to the year – no major incidents; Cleary Report will be out on October 1; reminder if you are working late on campus and would like security to escort you to your car just call the office; fire drills this week

NDCPD – received more than expected on our core grant renewal; Power Up Health conference (state-wide); working on grant to keep track of people with aging disabilities; hosting a speaker on 9/26/19 at 7:00 in Memorial #114

VPAA – A. Armstrong has been keeping busy working on grant applications; strategic planning is back into meeting regularly; HLC team is working on a draft – editing coming soon; still have a few searches taking place; NotStock will be held toward the end of October

Alumni – many events coming up: homecoming, Golden Awards, fall alum speakers series – all are encouraged to participate; free showing of Toy Story 4 in the Dome on 9/28/19
