# 2. President's Report

- Thanks to everyone who helped with all the activities to kick off the fall semester so many things taking place and everything ran smoothly
- Enrollment does show that we are down in head count by around 2.8%; FTE is down around 1.1%;
  these numbers will change once we get dual credit numbers calculated

- We are closer to where we were in fall 2019 as far as normal operations on campus, but we still have challenges remaining with COVID; discretion to faculty and staff regarding masks, etc.; we don't know what the future holds and we have to remain flexible to change as needed
- UND/NDSU have issued a mask mandate for this fall; we all need to look at what is taking place in their particular region/communities
- We now have a Day Care located in Dakota Hall; thanks to all that were involved in making this happen special thanks to those offices who had to move to other areas on campus to accommodate this facility; fits in well with our strategic plan and also allows for several departments to have students involved
- Had a great summer theater season and renovation continues
- On a personal note, thanks to all who have reached out with well-wishes, gifts, etc. for our family as our daughter goes through her medical issues

# 2. Acknowledgements/Announcements:

DCB/Minot – have 49 students on the Minot campus

Career Svcs – hosting a community fair on Sept. 9; will hold a community health fair toward the end of September

Wellness – thanks for everyone participating in RecFest as well as staff training sessions; intramurals will start soon; promoting more outdoor events – have a lot of lawn games, camping gear, kayaks, etc., available for use

Athletics – we have the largest group of student athletes we have ever had; held an exhibition soccer match last night; gearing up for fall sports; had almost 1,000 students on campus over the summer for a variety of camps

International – we welcomed around 63 new international students (including Canadians); changed arrival orientation (F1) and moved it to on-line so students can now complete before they leave their home country – they don't have to wait until they are here before having the information; the shopping shuttle is being reinstated; taxi passes have not been convenient for students so now we will offer free taxi rides; held a pizza partly last Wednesday and held an international bingo event; working with ND Humanities to have a speaker live-streamed in October addressing hate

Design/Print Svcs – have changed the department name to better reflect services offered; bulk orders were due last Monday but will take them through today; directory changes are due today; a lot of people are using the university Montserrat font for their emails and it is not a very good font to use as you cannot print those emails – use a standard font

VPAA – presented strategic plan updates during mini sessions and are now seeking campus input; will present to faculty senate and can to staff senate and student government as well; will keep sharing as we update; should be done by the end of fall semester; Notstock is set for September 23-25 with many different activities; HLC will be here next April

ASC – great turnout for welcome weekend; thanks to all who helped with all the opening activities; we have hired a new access services coordinator as well as a new military resource academic coach in the Power Center; tutoring starts next week

Student Health – have hired a new nurse practitioner; still working with DoH for Covid cases; some changes with close contact quarantines as they have an option to test out early; continued Covid testing for those with symptoms; counselors have been busy; immunization holds on student accounts have been taking place

VPSA – updated protocols are available on the web page; carry a mask with you as some departments may request that you wear a mask; vaccination clinic this Friday in the conference center; working on an incentive program for students; notices will be notified of any students that test positive or a close contact – if student tells you something else please contact student affairs; direct questions to Covidcore@ minotstateu.edu where a group of people can solve questions rapidly

Question about university common spaces – our protocols right now are for classrooms; at this time, we do not have anything for hallways or common areas but will be ready to adapt should there be a need

JLG is working on a scaled back student center renovation and we hope to have proposals soon; reimagining an outdoor gathering space (Quad) that could be used for multiple student activities as well as academic pursuits to be used year round; thanks to student affairs team to work together to enhance opportunities for engaging students

Advancement – foundation had a record year - \$11.7M; 24 new endowments; assets over \$15M; 61% faculty and staff giving; good to travel again and meet with donors; honored new inductees into the Old Main Society on August 4; Summer Theater is now in phase 2 of renovation; Homecoming is October 4-9; hosting emeritus faculty and staff today for lunch on campus

Military Resources – National Guard education on campus; hosted visits from DCB and VCSU; participated in MAFB Homefront as well as an education briefing with MAFB; invited to participate in survey through MHEC on military student policy; training with VA with substance abuse among veterans; 9/11 will be the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of this event – please be sensitive to veterans as many still have difficulty dealing with events of that day

Marketing – thanks to all who have helped since coming on board; hired a web content specialist; refreshing billboards around Minot; working on a new commercial

Library – new instruction librarian; continue working on scanning yearbooks; have finally received a new security system

NDCPD – busy writing grants – waiting to hear on seven of them, six in progress, and 3 that we anticipate we will be participating in the writing; have 10 new Astep students and about 10 more returning students

U Comm – President report went out; working on fall Connections; need story ideas; have a new student writer for this semester

Alum – hosted events in Fargo and Bismarck; had good participation in summer golf outings and for the State Fair parade; Homecoming events include: Decade reunion for 1970's, block party, Golden Awards, President's Club lunch, reunions, etc.

NA – thanks for everyone who helped with welcome week activities; held mini sessions for convocations; will attend two tribal college fairs; tipi went up on Monday and plan to host some educational sessions; Powwow committee has met and sent a virtual Save the Date notice

DCB – enrollment is tracking close to last year – still waiting for Farm Management and Dual credit numbers to get entered; consolidated all academic support services in one area – "Academic Atrium"; approved to have a new cohort with the State Hospital in Jamestown for nursing; making significant progress with CTE in Minot; added a new sport – trap shooting; DCB Covid protocols are very similar to those at MSU; dining center renovation is making good progress and hopefully be open in January

Enrollment/Grad – R. Conway is the new director of the Severson Entrepreneurship Center – he will also be teaching; he is also looking for more internship opportunities

CEL – online is up and running and was a very smooth opening for the semester; computer science is offering their entire program rea- time online

IR – many reporting processes have to wait until the official census numbers are in; reminder that the data request form is online

Security – updated some cameras over the summer; participated in active shooter training on campus with local first responders; working on the Cleary Report – please watch the video if you are instructed to do so; involved in new faculty orientation as well as RA training; hired two CJ students to work in the department and get a little experience for a future in law enforcement

Student Center – SGA meetings will now be held Tuesday evenings as that will work better for students; parade information will be going out next week; good number of students at activities and events; great dining plan through Sodexo for faculty and staff

Registrar – enrollment numbers were sent to all cabinet members; we have made some personnel changes in the department as far as responsibilities go; will be hiring a new administrative assistant

Residence Life – move in day went well – we are down about 15 from last fall; office moved into the Student Center; updating some apartments; more updates to McCulloch

Looyenga Center – good start to the semester; did some training with residence life and wellness center to build some leadership skills in those students; 20 leadership workshops coming up this fall; 21 in our Lead 101 class

Enrollment – thanks to all who helped with orientation, etc.; have two new recruiters; most of recruitment plans are going to be face to face except for Minnesota; plan on having the usual schedule of on campus visits

Business Office – year end process is wrapping up; operational audit completed with no findings; new regulation required movement of some fund numbers – please check the Business Office page

Financial Aid – if you haven't completed your dependent waiver form please do so as soon as possible; continue to package students as FAFSA's are still coming in; special circumstance appeals have taken up a lot of time – lots of requests for a review due to income fluctuations; work study jobs need to be posted through the HR web site

VPAF – this summer has been very busy in administration and finance especially when dealing with Covid dollars; business office and financial aid have been extremely busy; facilities management has done a fantastic job of keeping the campus looking great; IT works all summer updating equipment, etc.; security has done a wonderful job of keeping up with all the extra events that take place during the summer; was able to refinance our debt – took advantage of lower interest rates out there now – will save us a lot of funds in the coming years and we were able to keep our A Bond rating
