1. Senate Reports

2. President's Report

- Our annual Tech Day is taking place today with a number of area high school students participating –
 SRT is a major sponsor for this event
- Tomorrow is NoDAKon First Western Bank and Trust is a major sponsor for this event
- K. Lambrecht, C. Simone, and S. Shirley presented to the OMB on September 30 in preparation for the Governor's budget; our downtown concept for allied health in conjunction with DCB is well received but we will need state funding to re-tool the building
- DCB's need is residence housing improvements
- There are five measures on the ballot one in particular, if it passes, will need the legislator's attention almost immediately to address the shortfall that would be caused if the measure passes; this means that other items would probably be delayed in receiving any action by the legislature
- As part of our designation as a <u>National Center of Academic Excellence in Cyber Defense</u> (CAE -CD) for the validated program(s) of study, all the presidents of institutions with the same designation get together annually for updates and that meeting was held last week in St. Louis
