## Legislative update

The legislature was very good to higher education this past session. They did approve a 5% salary increase for state employees who will bring us either at or very close to our peer institutions.

The Compensation Task Force has reviewed market rates and will be bringing full time professors and clerical help up to 96% of their market rate.

They have also required us to keep the tuition increases to no more than 4%.

## **Building projects**

Swain did receive more funding so we should be able to complete that project

We did get \$2.5 approved towards the boiler but will be able to apply towards geothermal if we find funding for that project.

Timeline for moving physical plant building – should go to bid in August. Plan is to shell it out before winter and finish the inside during the winter with our own people.

Have asked for stimulus funding to hopefully convert campus to geothermal
