### Current

## First-Day Enrollment

As of the first day of classes, enrollment shows an increase of 6%. Our full-time-equivalent numbers increased 6.7%. Other key areas recorded increases, such as Ward County, e-learning, new first-year students, international, and graduate students. Native Americans numbers dropped slightly. Transfer numbers increased only slightly at 1.3%. The census date for official enrollments is in the fourth week.

### Convocation

New faculty and staff were introduced and welcomed. Remarks from Cheryl Nilson, Linda Benson, Chase Lee, and Selmer Moen provided an overview of the plans for our senates for the new academic year.

## Chronicle of Higher Education article

The Chronicle interviewed a number of people on campus to learn more about our work on faculty and staff compensation. The article appeared in the Chronicle this summer.

## Northern Sun Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Visit to MSU

The NSIC Board of Directors in June voted to send a team of conference representatives to Minot State to tour and discuss conference membership with the campus. The visit is scheduled for October 19-20. Following the visit, the NSIC will vote to determine if MSU will be invited to join the conference. The decision will probably be made and communicated in January 2011.

### Trinity-MSU Center of Excellence Proposal to the Budget Section in June

The geriatrics centers project we presented to the Budget Section of the legislature failed on a vote of 19-19.

## Landscaping

The landscaping committee met with a landscape architect to discuss the next phase of the plan. Plans for extending the landscaping from the cemetery to Dakota and for landscaping around Swain were reviewed.

### Retention Task Force

The task force has met three times this summer to continue to identify strategies to improve first-year retention. Specific plans were agreed upon to pursue this coming year.

## Title IV Trio Program

We received great news that our Trio Proposal was funded. This will allow us to establish a center to support outreach to populations particularly prone to dropping out of college.

### FIPSE Veterans Grant proposal

A Minot State team worked to prepare a grant proposal to seek support of a veterans' assistance center on campus. The proposal looks very competitive. We should receive word in the next month if we are funded.

### Bid Opening for Wellness Center in June

The construction bids came in about \$1 million over our authority and projected budget. We rejected the bids and have asked our architects to complete a redesign to reduce the cost of the building. We are hoping to solicit bids in October, with construction commencing as late as March, and completion in spring or summer of 2012.

### President's Staff Retreat

The members of Presidents Staff participated in a full-day retreat in July. Performance indicators, building projects, athletic funding and the NCAA, and other special projects and needs were discussed.

#### YWCA and Child Care

The fund we were going to use to support the construction of the new maintenance facility on the north end of campus was reduced considerably to support equipment purchases in Swain. We will need to consider long-term plans for funding of the facility before proceeding with the collaborative effort to work with the YWCA on the adjoining child-care facility. At this point the project is on hold until we seek approval from the SBHE and then determine how we can finance the project.

## Swain Hall Opening and Dedication

Many dignitaries, including ND Governor Hoeven, US Congressman Pomeroy, ND Senator Karen Krebsbach and ND Representative Matt Klein, to name but a few, gathered to commemorate the opening of Swain Hall recently. The Chamber's Ambassadors were on hand to hold a ribbon cutting. A large crowd gathered to witness the event.

### Athletic Field

The new Herb Parker Field Turf athletic field was dedicated recently by a ribbon cutting and honoring of Marge Parker and family. The first official game will be played on the field on August 26.

## **Interim Higher Education Meetings**

A number of meetings have been held by the committee to discuss plans for higher education support in the upcoming legislative session. The committee has requested considerable information about the NDUS operations and budgets, and have raised a number of critical questions about higher education's effectiveness.

## Fall Kick-Off Faculty and Staff Event at the Zoo

The Staff Senate organized and hosted another successful faculty-staff event to start off the new academic year. The food, prizes, and entertainment were well received by those who joined us.

### Move-In Day

A number of faculty, staff, friends, and athletes pitched in to help students move into their residence hall rooms. A barbecue was held, music was played by KMSU, and faculty and staff came dressed in their red shirts to show their support of our students.

# SBHE Strategic Goals

The Board has distributed specific performance indicators that the campuses are to use in setting goals this year. Minot State has shared the objectives campus wide and will continue to monitor our success in reaching those goals.

# SBHE Capital Projects

The SBHE approved the list of 12 capital projects that will be proposed to the legislature. Our geothermal project, in the amount of \$5 million is listed as sixth on the list.

## Preliminary Plan or Athletic Field Bleachers and Competition Track

A bleacher company has been contacted about the possible construction of metal bleachers for our stadium seating. The company is putting together preliminary plans for our review. Our architects will be proceeding to investigate the potential for a competition track north of the current athletic field. As soon as the final designs for the wellness center are completed, the architects will turn their attention to this complex and track.

Collaborative Discussion with MADC and EID for a Computer Science Partnership and COE The Minot Area Development Corporation has been working with us to investigate a potential COE project involving our computer science program and a technology company considering Minot. We hosted meetings with company officials, and participated in hosting a reception for community leaders and company officials.

## National Economics University in Hanoi

We will proceed with plans to realize a number of the strategies identified in our articulation agreement signed with NEU. Faculty and student exchanges, study tours there and here, and collaborative degree programs will be under consideration.

## Geothermal project

The M.E.P. associates have presented a design for the quadrant serving the new Wellness Center, Swain Hall, and the Gordon B. Olson Library. We will be seeking authority to proceed with the drilling of the wells on Allen Field. The \$3.5 million will be utilized to support this project.

## Wellness Center expanded authority granted

In June we went before the Budget Section of the Legislature to seek expanded authority for the wellness center at \$12.8 million. The proposed expanded authority included the increase in projected cost from \$10 million, the addition of a skywalk between the center and Swain, the construction of a climbing wall, and the purchase of additional equipment. The Budget Section vote was 21-19 in favor.

# Office and Program Planned Moves and Schedule

The Division of Social Science has completed its move to Old Main, and our teacher education program has moved into Swain. The use of the third floor of Administration is now under consideration for the new Trio program and other offices.
