SUBJECT: ¹Monthly President's Report

Current

Legislative Preparation and Hearings

Minot State University hosted and sponsored three legislators' meetings. A hosted reception for all local legislators to present current projects, a student-organized function to present students' comments and issues, and a faculty hosted event for legislators were held on campus in the last month. The events offered legislators information about our university's projects and the opportunity to discuss the upcoming legislative session.

Presentation to Office of Management and Budget

Each of the university presidents was asked to make formal presentations to OMB and to respond to questions about fiscal efficiencies, collaboration, and specific institutional projects. Minot State University's presentation provided examples of our fiscal responsibility, cost-savings efforts, and collaborations. Our compensation task force results were shared, and with it, the request to continue to support increased salaries. A detailed report on our ranked geothermal project and request was distributed and reviewed to emphasize the fiscal and environmental benefits of the system.

Governor's Budget Recommendation

Among many line items, the Governor recommended a 3% increase in salaries (compared to the SBHE's 4.5% request), a 1% contribution from that salary increase to retirement, a reduction in the equity dollars awarded to each campus, and a \$5 million performance incentive pool. That performance pool will be used to fund institutions who demonstrate increased completion rates and graduation rates. A commission will be appointed to define the criteria and to award funds from that pool. Our geothermal request for \$5 million was not included in the governor's recommendation. The SBHE will consider which items in the original requests should be supported and advanced. We will urge the SBHE and local legislators to continue to advocate for the support of the continued development of the geothermal system.

Northern Sun Intercollegiate Athletic Conference

Last week I travelled to Bemidji and Duluth to meet with the new chancellors of those universities and to familiarize them with Minot State University and seek their support for the upcoming board vote for our membership in the NSIC. The meetings went well. I have continued to stay in touch with the other presidents in the conference, sending them copies of <u>Connections</u> and speaking to them directly at conferences and by phone. The NSIC team visit to our campus went exceptionally well. I heard often from the team members how impressed they were with our campus, our academic programs, and our facilities. The vote by the board of directors of the NSIC is scheduled to occur on January 20, 2011.

¹ The President's Report is a monthly summary of activities in the president's office and current issues affecting the campus. Since no University Cabinet meeting was held in November, this report covers two months instead of one. The report is distributed widely to keep the community up to date on current initiatives and decisions. The report is provided at the monthly meeting of the University Cabinet, an advisory council comprised of all directors, vice presidents, and senate presidents. This report is distributed electronically to all faculty and staff, student leaders, the Board of Regents, Foundation Board of Directors, and Alumni Board. The report is also posted on the university's web site. Anyone interested in learning more about this information may contact the President's Office or the president directly.

Great Plains Community Research and Service Center

Neil Sharpe and Paul Markel have agreed to serve as co-chairs of our new program. The Department of Education, through the help of our Washington Delegation, most notably Senator Dorgan, secured a first-year award for \$950,000. We have been meeting regularly to review the grant requirements and to discuss potential projects and marketing. Recently our co-directors were interviewed on Merle Pepcorn's Prairie Public radio program.

Hobson's International Consulting Visit

A representative from this consulting firm visited campus and met with faculty, staff, students, and members of President's Staff regarding directions for our international program. A report is expected in the near future.

Geothermal Project

The test wells have been drilled on Allen Field. It is still anticipated that the 450 wells for the first area of our geothermal system will be installed this spring. We met with the MEP Associates' engineers about the well field and other details. Professor John Webster was able to join the meeting to discuss the potential for student monitoring of the system and the potential of an alternative energy curriculum or series of courses focused on geothermal energy. Another possibility being considered is to make available the field for a new competition track which could be installed above the well fields.

Administration Building Renovations

The University Cabinet reviewed and discussed possible renovations to the Administration Building at its October meeting. Architectural drawings were distributed and members of the Cabinet were encouraged to review the drawings and submit ideas, suggestions, and concerns to their respective vice president. The preliminary plan is to convert the first floor to a student service center, to include enrollment management, admissions, the registrar's office, financial aid, and other services to provide for a one-stop shopping concept for students. Revised architectural plans will be distributed at the Cabinet meeting today.

NCATE

The Teacher Education program recently was visited by the NCATE evaluation team and evaluators from North Dakota. The initial findings were positive. The department is currently responding to a few specific concerns expressed by the team. Congratulations to our department and the many faculty and staff who worked hard in preparation for this visit and review.

Campus Open Forums

The two open forums held in November included general discussions about campus topics and issues and a presentation of the budget Minot State is submitting as a part of the SBHE proposal to the legislature. Copies of the written and oral comments made by participants at the meetings have been distributed to the Cabinet. Both forums were well attended and involved considerable discussion.

Academic Advising

As a part of our continued efforts to increase our retention and graduation rates and to respond to statewide calls for improving these performance measures, I am working with the retention committee, the new advising coordinator, the VPAA, and the executive committee of the Faculty Senate to define principles and a system to strengthen our advising system on campus. I wrote a letter defining the needs and identifying steps necessary to strengthen academic advising on our campus. This letter was presented to the Faculty Senate for its review and endorsement.

Faculty Workload strategies

In response to a variety of concerns expressed about some faculty members' workloads, I asked Selmer Moen, Cheryl Nilsen, and Patti Fedje to meet with me to review a list of 20 strategies to address these concerns. These strategies are currently under consideration by the executive committee. We'll meet in January to review and revise accordingly the strategies before bringing the recommendations back to the deans, chairs, and Faculty Senate.

Grow North Dakota analysis

This flat-rate tuition plan, which went into effect at the beginning of this current academic year, was examined by our enrollment management office, marketing, finance office, student affairs and residence hall offices, and institutional research office. The results indicated that the plan is working well and has led to increased enrollment in targeted areas. I have asked our recruitment office, marking office, and student affairs office to bring back proposals for additional support and activities this year and next.

Residence Halls

Our residence halls are nearly full this semester, and the prospect for future growth is now strong. The Beaver Ridge Plaza now being constructed to the east of the campus, the Greek houses, future apartment planning, and a potential new Campus Heights are under consideration to meet these new demands for housing on campus.

Recruitment

Based on the analysis of the current enrollments and the results of the Grow North Dakota plan, our recruitment office has arranged for Noel Levitz to visit us to offer us guidance about developing an enrollment management plan. The plan will include target enrollment goals for specific areas on campus and for the total campus. With a plan, we should be able to set goals for residence halls spaces, classroom utilization, and academic program quality enhancements and directions.

TRIO Implementation

Dr. Jenkins and the search committees have completed their searches and hired highly qualified staff members for our new TRIO program. The TRIO offices will be housed in the current locations of the Jones Room and the food services offices. Those areas are being remodeled and renovated. The Jones Room will be relocated to the third floor of the Administration Building to provide for space for TRIO.

Veterans' Service Center

In the last year, the number of veterans seeking direct support from our offices has increased significantly. Our Financial Aid office, for instance, has raised concerns about the need to provide veterans more support. In the past six months we have been looking at other institutional models for veterans' centers on campus and have been considering developing a center connected to our student success center. Funds are available through existing resources and through the student affairs office to support a center director. A draft job description has been developed and circulated for review. A decision will be made soon about when and how to proceed.

Registrar's Position

Two additional candidates are on campus this week. Interviews are being conducted, including open forums with presentations and meetings with various constituencies. The search committee will be convening soon after the last interview to make a recommendation.

Wellness Center Bids and Construction Plans

The accepted bids for the general contractor (Roer's Construction), mechanical (Mobray and Sons), and electrical (Main Electric) came under our identified budget authority. The contractors indicated construction will begin by March 1, 2011. The building is to be completed within 14 months.

Inaugural Wrestling Meet

The return of wrestling to Minot State, after nearly a 30-year hiatus, began with a dual meet with the University of Mary. With a large turnout and a recognition event of the donors who made the return possible, the night could not have been better with the Beavers winning the dual meet with this Division II institution. Our team and new coach were well received by the campus and our wrestling community.

AASCU Meeting in Charleston

This presidents' conference included a variety of useful events. The meetings I attended included special sessions on international program growth, strategies to address the impact of the economy on the institutions, veterans support centers, federal and legislative updates, and keynote speakers addressing the political changes and the impacts on higher education. I was also able to meet with a number of presidents from the NSIC to discuss our membership bid.

Discussion with BSC about expanded role for MSU on BSC Campus

A couple of months ago Larry Skogen, the president of BSC, and I discussed MSU's presence on the BSC campus and considered other opportunities for growth in programs and enrollments. In response, we arranged a meeting at BSC with Dr. Skogen and his staff and MSU staff. We had a productive discussion about programming, marketing, and increased presence on the BSC campus. Plans are now being considered.

Joint Meeting of Senates' Executive Committees

Last week the three executive committees (Faculty Senate, Staff Senate, and the Student Government Association) met with members of President's Staff to discuss current topics, initiatives, and issues. The agenda included the search for the new VPAA, a potential new associate vice president for academic affairs, academic advising, renovations in the administration building, the veterans' center, Division II athletics, various building projects, child care, housing pressures, Greek life, CEL financing, international education, and the Governor's budget. Brief reports were provided on each, with time set aside for questions and discussion.

Centennial Committee

A well-represented steering committee has been formed. Its first meeting was held to discuss its charge, the objectives to engage the work of subcommittees, and the timeline for work to coordinate and monitor campus activities in support of our centennial in 2013-2014. A task force had been formed to research other centennial projects and to suggest potential initiatives for our own. That report was provided to the steering committee at its first meeting.

Collaboration with Dakota College at Bottineau

A joint meeting of DCB dean's council and MSU's President's Staff has been scheduled to identify potential collaborative programs. The Passport Program and our joint work in nursing are two of the most recent collaborations.
