- 1. Login to SLL. Click Gateways on the left-hand side. Click into your Licensure Plan (example: Licensure Plan for F21 ECE). Navigate to the Admission Gateway.
- 2. Reading, Writing, and Math Competency Section You must provide proof you have appropriate General Knowledge in Reading, Writing, and Math. Those requirements are listed on the second page of this form.

 Upload PDF proof for each of your Reading, Writing, and Math Competencies in this section. Make sure you upload all documents, before pressing Submit for Review.
- 3. NDBCI Background Check Section Upload a PDF of the email you received from Deb Ringham in regard to your most recent background check. A PDF of your Substitute Teaching license also qualifies. If you need assistance with the background check, see Deb in Swain 218.
- 4. <u>Advisor Sign-off Form Section</u> You and your advisor should go through the steps on this form and verify all have been completed. You and your advisor need to sign this form at the bottom. Once signed, you can upload this form to SLL.

Reading -

- Grade of "A" or "B" in ENGL 110 (or appropriate English Literature Course)
- ACT Reading Score of 20 or Higher
- Praxis I CASE Test Score of 156 or Higher
- SAT Score of 540 or Higher
- Previously Completed Bachelor's Degree or Higher

Writing -

- Grade of "A" or "B" in ENGL 120
- ACT ELA score of 20 or Higher
- ACT Writing score of 6.5 or Higher
- Praxis I CASE Test Score of 160 or Higher
- SAT Score of 5 or Higher
- Previously Completed Bachelor's Degree or Higher

Math -

- Grade of "A" or "B" in Math 103, 104, 107, 165, 210, 277, 377, 378
- ACT Math score of 21 or Higher
- Praxis I CASE Test Score of 150 or Higher
- SAT Score of 530 or Higher
- Previously Completed Bachelor's Degree or Higher

Cumulative and Major GPAs can be found on your Academic Requirements Report in Campus Connection. You must have a 2.50 in both Cumulative and Major GPAs to be accepted.

Recalculated GPA information

Students who have met all other requirements for Admission to Teacher Education and do not hold an overall GPA of 2.75, but do demonstrate 3.00 GPA in their last 45 semester hours of study, may petition for special review by TEAC for admission to Teacher Education. Students granted admission by TEAC under this provision must demonstrate an overall GPA of 2.75 prior to Student Teaching.

Students who do not meet the cumulative GPA are also allowed to file an appeal to TEAC and submit a GPA calculation that counts only courses required for the full four-year degree (including general education courses). Students must upload the paper with the advisor's re-calculation on it with this application.
