



GI Bill enrollment verification FAQs

You will need to verify your enrollment every month to receive your GI Bill benefit payments. Your enrollment verification helps avoid overpayments that you would need to pay back later.

Find out how to verify your enrollment

(Verify Your School Enrollment | Veterans Affairs)

Do I need to verify my enrollment?

For Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits: You will need to verify your enrollment if you get monthly housing allowance or kicker payments.

Both of these must be true for you:

- You are enrolled in an institution of higher learning or a non-college degree program, like training for HVAC repair or truck driving, **and**
- You are enrolled half-time or more

You do not need to verify your enrollment if you're completing an apprenticeship, or on-the-job, flight, or correspondence training.

For Montgomery GI Bill benefits: You will need to verify your enrollment if both of these are true for you:

- You are enrolled in an institution of higher learning or a non-college degree program, like training for HVAC repair or truck driving, and
- You are enrolled half-time or more

You do not need to verify your enrollment if you are completing an apprenticeship, or on-the-job, flight, or correspondence training.

If you do not verify your enrollment

For Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits: We will pause your monthly benefit payments after 2 consecutive months of not verifying your enrollment.

For Montgomery GI Bill benefits: We will not send your monthly benefits payment if you do not verify your enrollment.

When do I verify my enrollment?

You will need to verify your enrollment at the end of every month after your school starts. For example, if your school starts on August 5, you will need to verify your enrollment on or after August 31. If you were enrolled in school for any part of the month, you will need to verify your enrollment for that month. For example, if your school ends on May 5, you will need to verify your enrollment for the month of May on or after May 5.

When will I get my monthly benefit payment?

For Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits: We process your benefit payment on the first day of every month. It can take up to 5 days to arrive.

If you get your monthly benefit payment before verifying your enrollment, you should still verify your enrollment. We pause your monthly benefit payments after 2 consecutive months of not verifying your enrollment.

For Montgomery GI Bill benefits: We process your benefit payment after you verify your enrollment. It can take up to 5 days to arrive.

If you do not get your monthly benefit payment after 5 days

You can contact us through Ask VA to ask about your benefit payment.

Note: The updates you make using this tool will change only the direct deposit and contact information connected to your Montgomery GI Bill benefits. To update your information for any other benefits, you'll need to go to your VA.gov profile.



The Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Human Exploitation Rescue Operation (HERO) Child Rescue Corps is a paid federal internship that is open to disabled veterans and disabled active duty service members who are transitioning out of the service due to wounds, illness, or injury. (VA/DoD Disability rating)

The HERO Program is operated by HSI and managed by the DHS Cyber Crimes Center.

The program mission is to combat the growing problem of child exploitation by recruiting, training, and equipping wounded, ill, or injured veterans to become computer forensic analysts (CFAs). Although positions are not guaranteed, our goal at the end of the internship is to hire successful interns as full-time CFAs to assist Special Agents in the rescue of child sexual victims, the prosecution of sexual predators, and the prevention of child sexual abuse.

The HERO Program consists of 13 weeks of paid HSI introductory and forensic training, followed by a 9 month long paid internship in computer forensics at HSI offices throughout the U.S. Locations are selected during the application and hiring process.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

- VA/DOD Disability Rating or Statement of Service
- Proof of Honorable Discharge (DD214)
- Provide all requested supporting documents to include an essay addressing specific topics
- Pass Criminal History, Background Investigation, and Drug Test Screening
- Obtain and maintain Top Secret Clearance
- Must attend all interviews and training
- Willing to relocate at own expense to selected office location

PROGRAM TRAINING:

- -13 weeks of paid introductory and computer forensic training in Fairfax, VA, leading to certifications in Comp TIA A+ and forensic software programs
- 9 months paid practical experience assisting HSI Special Agents with criminal cases and prosecutions at various HSI domestic office locations

PROGRAM BENEFITS:

- Paid training and internship at the GS-5 or GS-7 grade level
- Lodging and perdiem provided during the 13 weeks of training
- Paid Annual Leave, Sick leave, and Holidays
- Federal Health, Dental, and Vision Insurance
